



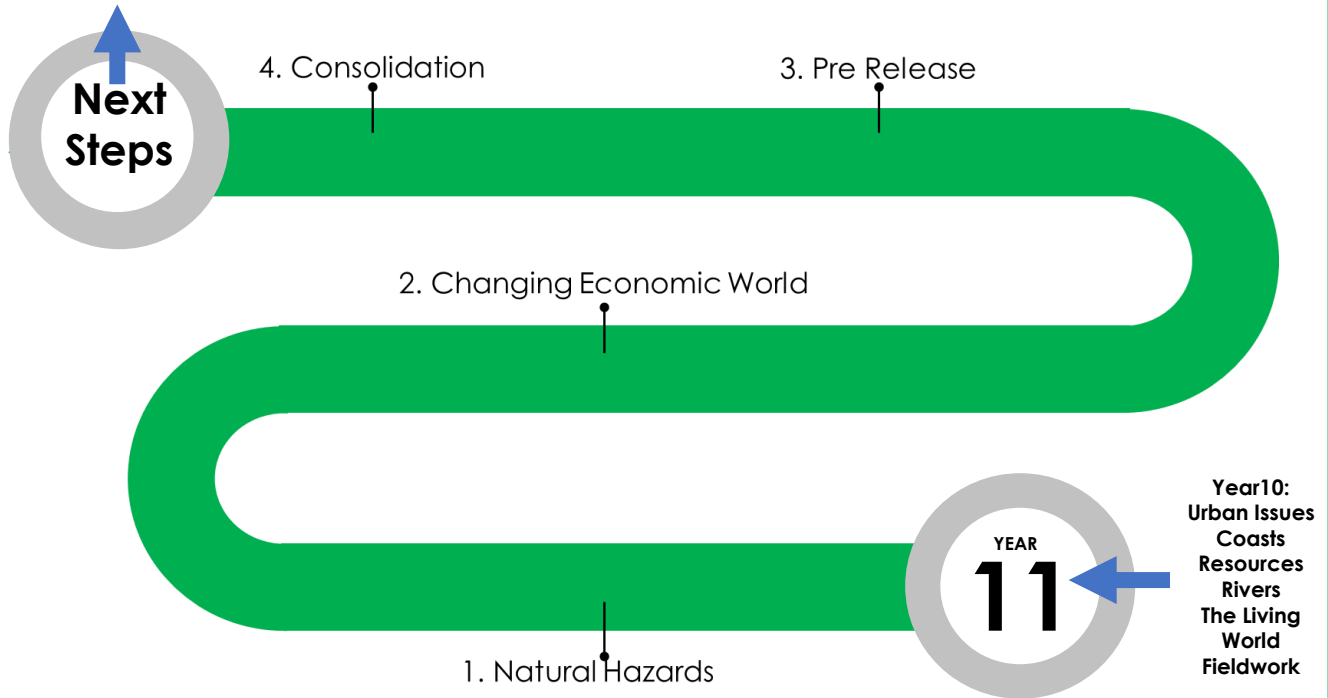
MY LEARNING JOURNEY- Year 11

Topic	Overview	Why here? Why now?
Paper 1: The challenge of Natural Hazards	How do earthquakes, volcanoes and tropical storms form? What impacts do they have on people? Why are they worse in some countries than others? You will focus on Typhoon Haiyan and earthquakes in New Zealand and Nepal.	The largest and most complicated Physical topic requires your knowledge from all of KS3 and KS4 so far to tackle.
Paper 2: The Changing Economic World	What makes some countries more developed than others? How do we measure a country's development? What can we do to make the world a more equal place? Your case studies will be the UK and Nigeria.	The most complicated Human topic on your GCSE you will need to build upon your development knowledge from Year 9 and your Urban Issues knowledge from Year 10.
Paper 3: Pre Release	Each year the AQA exam board releases a document with an "issue evaluation". You must read and learn the key information from this document. The first half of Paper 3 will examine your knowledge of the Issue.	This point in the year is when the Pre Release Issue Evaluation is released from the exam board.
Consolidation	By this time you will have completed the course and will be able to spend some time consolidating any parts of the course you may have found difficult.	You will have finished all of the content from the course.
