Role of the tutor

- The role of the tutor is vital. As it states in our handbook "The role of the form tutor is an integral part of working in a Catholic school. It is often through this role that we get to really know our pupils. The role of the form tutor is of central importance to living out our mission to form the whole person."
- In the same way as our academic curriculum, the key to a successful tutor is consistency.
- Please ensure all form resources are used and are fully followed. The only exception to this, is if your form is preparing for an assembly or liturgy, during which time the only expectation is the prayer and the attendance task.











Role of the tutor

- For our \$48/ Catholic School Inspection, a large part of the judgement for two of the three sections (Catholic Life and Collective Worship) will be based on pupils experience in form time/ assembly/ personal development days.
- During day 2 of the inspection, inspectors will meet with 12 pupils from KS3 and 12 pupils from KS4, (these pupils will be selected at random).
- The inspectors will ask pupils questions which will be similar to those provided to us by the Diocese.

- There are 7 pillars within CST...










1 DIGNITY






