If you adore these seasonal feelings as much as we do, then you'll certainly melt over these books that are set on or around the holidays.




Let It Snow




Refuge





YEAR IN REVIEW 2022

Before greeting 2023, let's look back at the moments that got us here. To recap 2022, here are some of the events that have most affected the world in 2022.

January: Guatemala's FUEGO VOLCANO erupts. It explodes up to 13 times an hour in January. Ash plumes climb nearly three miles into the air.

February: Ukrainian military vehicles move through the capital city of Kyiv. They are rushing to defend the country as Russia's INVASION OF UKRAINE begins. The war is ongoing.

March: The Hubble Space Telescope observes the most distant single star ever. The star, named Earendel by astronomers, is 28 billion light-years away.

April: The first known dinosaur fossil linked to the very day of the Chicxulub impact is reported by palaeontologists at the Tanis site in North Dakota, US.

May: Eurovision Song Contest 2022—The UK entry performed by Sam Ryder finishes in second place with 466 points, and wins the jury vote.

June: Queen Elizabeth II celebrates her PLATINUM JUBILEE. It marks 70 years of her being the queen of Great Britain.

July: NASA releases an image of the dust and stars forming the Carina Nebula. It's one of the first shots shown from the JAMES WEBB SPACE TELESCOPE.

August: Two-thirds of Australia's Great Barrier Reef showed the largest amount of coral cover in 36 years.

September: Queen Elizabeth II passes away at the age of 96. She is succeeded by her son, King Charles III.

October: Rishi Sunak becomes the first British Asian Prime Minister.

November: NASA's ARTEMIS ROCKET is launched at Cape Canaveral, Florida. Its un-crewed mission to the moon and back will last 26 days.

December: Argentina wins the 2022 World Cup in Qatar. More than a million fans gathered in Buenos Aires to celebrate the victory - its first in the World Cup since 1986.




