## OLSE EYFS Continuous Provision Overview

Within the Early Years at Our Lady and St Edward's play is at the heart of our provision. Play is prioritised and our timetable aims to maximise opportunities for our children to experience enriching play. Our learning environment has been carefully designed and planned to provide our children with opportunities for high quality play experiences and learning opportunities both within our classroom and our outdoor environment. The areas within our Reception continuous provision environment have been created and planned to provide children with a wealth of opportunities to use their play to learn within the Seven Areas of Learning. Continuous Provision documents have been created for each area of provision. These outline how each area is set up and provide details of the opportunities and ways in which learning within the Seven Areas of Learning takes place through each area of our provision.

Resources have been carefully chosen to ensure they are purposeful and enrich children's learning within their play. Our EYFS team supports the children within their play and provide challenge. This overview outlines the areas of continuous provision in our Reception environment and some of the key aspects of learning these areas provide the children through their play.
