Online Safety – (Online Safety Policies & Digital Consent Form)

Our school prides itself on making the latest technologies available to all pupils. The internet is a valuable tool and can offer many opportunities and experiences to our pupils. We take e-safety seriously and are committed to keeping all pupils and staff safe. Included with this newsletter is a permission form which school is required to send out to gain consent for use of images and videos of your children and your consent for them to use the internet. Detailed information about the permission statements is on the reverse of the form.

We cover lots of elements of online safety in school and appreciate your support in discussing the attached Online Safety Agreement which will be re-visited at the beginning of each academic year. Can you please discuss the Online Safety Agreement with your child and we will be regularly referring back to these during computing lessons throughout the year. Your children will be unable to use the internet until all of the forms have been completed, signed and returned to school.

We have subscribed to an Online Safety Newsletter which we will send to parents monthly – the first one is attached to this Newsletter.

Pupil Information Sheet

With this Newsletter pupils in Years 1 – 6 should receive a Pupil Data Collection Form for the academic year 2025/26. We would ask that you complete one form for each child and return to Mrs Kippax urgently (this form should be completed in conjunction with the Privacy Notice on the 'About Us' section of the school website). Please do not send one form for a number of children – we require individual forms for each child. Reception children will not receive this form as they have already completed it.

Safeguarding

A reminder that the Safeguarding and Child Protection policy is available on the school website. The school is also linked to Lancashire Police through Operation Encompass. Operation Encompass has been created to provide a service which reports incidents of Domestic Abuse. This means that by 9.00am on the next school day, the school's Key Adult will be informed that the child or young person has been involved in, heard or witnessed a domestic incident. This knowledge, given to schools through Operation Encompass, allows the provision of immediate early intervention through silent or overt support dependent upon the needs and wishes of the child. The Key Adult in school is Mrs Woods.

Reception Class Baseline Assessment

During the next few weeks, pupils in reception class will be taking part in assessment tasks. These tasks are computer based and the children will be supported by Miss Sudell throughout. The purpose of the tasks is to track the progress the children have made from Reception to Year 6. A parent information sheet which explains any questions you may have was emailed earlier this week.

School Uniform Rules and Ordering for September School Uniform & Other Rules

Please see below details of uniform expectations. If in doubt please call into the school office where you will be able to see samples. All uniform is available at 'Bang Bang' uniform shop in Preston City Centre and online from Stitch Design www.stitchdesign.co.uk

- Trousers, skirts, shorts and pinafores should be **grey NOT black**
- Cardigans and sweaters should have the school logo
- School shoes should be a full shoe with secure fastenings and not slip on shoes. Therefore, if you are buying new shoes please select a full shoe which fastens. Children can wear laced shoes as long as they know how to tie them. Pupils are expected to wear shoes to and from school and are allowed to change into trainers at lunchtime for comfort whilst playing games.
- PE kits should be grey school hoodie and black shorts (not cycling shorts) and black tracksuit bottoms/leggings. These must be plain and not contain any logos/stripes or patterns. Girls in KS2 can continue to wear the blue skort if they wish. Most of the supermarkets sell plain black shorts and tracksuit bottoms. Children may continue to wear the old uniform of blue shorts etc until they grow out of them so that parents are not going to an extra expense. PE t-shirts are house team t-shirts only.
- School caps & hats are available from Bang Bang Legionnaire's cap aimed at the KS1 children, and baseball cap aimed at the KS2 children. Alternatively pupils can wear a plain coloured hat with no logo
- Extreme hairstyles are not permitted in school which includes any shaved shapes/partings. If hair clippers are used, no lower than a number 2 is allowed on any part of the head and hair should be a blended cut with no ridges or lines. An excess of hair gel is also not allowed. Girls hair accessories are to be in school/hair colours only and of a reasonable size.
- **Ear-rings** are not permitted in school. Anyone who has had their ears pierced during the holidays and is waiting for the 6 weeks before they can be removed must cover their ear-rings with plasters. They must be removed as soon as possible. Plastic retainers may be worn but must be removed for PE/Sports.
- Sunglasses are not permitted in school (unless permission has previously been granted for medical purposes).
- A reminder too that all drinks bottles brought into school should only be filled with water – no juice. Please ensure that the drink bottle is only a small bottle as we have limited space in class to store these we have noticed that a number of children are bringing in extremely large bottles.
- Due to the limited space in EYFS & KS1 classrooms only school blue bags and drawstring PE bags should be brought into school in these classes. At times when children are required to bring additional equipment into school, eg extra-curricular sports kit, they should bring it in a small carrier bag.
- Children in KS2 can bring in a rucksack instead of the school blue bag. PE kits should be in a separate drawstring bag and must be in school at all times.

School Books

Please check at home for any books belonging to school that should have been returned; reading books, library books or textbooks. We are having a book amnesty so no questions will be asked. Books can be taken into class or to the office.

Occasionally reading books are lost or damaged at home. When this happens we request a donation towards the cost of replacement.

Harvest Celebrations - Friday 17th October

This year we will be celebrating our Harvest Assembly on Friday 17th October for the whole school led by Year 3. Year 3 parents welcome.

In addition, children in all year groups are asked to bring in donations of tinned/packet food, tea and coffee for Holy Family food bank. These can be sent in from Monday 13th October. Holy Family were most grateful last year and many local families benefitted from your generosity.

Important Information about School Attendance from LCC

You may be aware that the Department for Education last year announced national changes to penalty notices issued for unauthorised absence in term time. These changes came into effect on 19 August 2024.

The changes to be aware of are:

- Penalty notices will be charged at a rate of £160 per parent per child. This can be paid at £80 if paid within 21 days.
- Any second penalty notice issued to the same parent for the same child within a rolling 3-year period will be issued at the rate of £160 to be paid within 28 days with no option for a discounted rate.
- The threshold at which a penalty notice must be considered is set at 10 sessions (equivalent to 5 days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10-school week period. This may include absences as a result of arriving late after the register closes. The 10 school weeks may span different terms or school years.
- A maximum of 2 penalty notices may be issued to a parent for the same child within a rolling 3-year period, so at the 3rd (or subsequent) offence(s) another course of action will need to be considered (such as prosecution or one of the other attendance legal interventions).

Attendance Policy

A reminder that the attendance policy can be found on the website. The policy states that leave from school will only be granted under exceptional circumstances. Unauthorised leave may trigger a penalty notice from LCC. The school considers that 96% is the minimum acceptable attendance and attendance below this will be monitored. Attendance below 90% is considered as persistent absence and may be subject to an action plan.

<u>Leave request</u> - Leave from school must be requested prior to the leave taking place. Forms are available from the School Office. Leave will only be granted under exceptional circumstances as indicated by the DfE.

<u>Lateness</u> - The school gates to each playground will be locked at 8.55am & pupils should enter through the main entrance after this time. Any child arriving after 9.00am is late and must be signed in by a parent/guardian of the child. Children who leave for appointments during the school day must also be signed out and in the same way.

<u>Medical appointments</u> – Evidence will be required for any medical appointment during school hours. Please bring a copy of the appointment letter/card (if available) to the school office prior to the day of the appointment.

<u>Sickness absence at the beginning and end of term</u> - Sickness absences at the start or end of a term must be accompanied by a doctor's note or prescription to verify your child's reason for absence. However, if this is not possible as not all sickness requires medical attention, then we request that you call into school to see us if we cannot contact you via your landline. If we do not receive verification, then the absence will be recorded as unauthorised.

School Lunches

Can I remind parents that we require half a term's notice to change from packed lunches to school meals and vice versa, except for Reception pupils in their first half term. This includes **any** alterations to current arrangements.

Please keep a check on Arbor as your balance should always be in credit (Year 3-6 only). A reminder that school meals are now £2.90 per day.

Adventure Areas

A reminder to all pupils that the adventure areas are not to be used at the end of the school day.

Medication in School

A reminder to parents that where clinically possible, medicines should be prescribed in dose frequencies which enable them to be taken outside school hours. If a child attends the school club then staff will administer a dose at the end of the school day. If medication is required 4 times a day then school will administer a dose at 11.00am.

If your child requires **prescribed** medication in school we only accept this medication if it is in date, labelled, provided in the original container as dispensed by a pharmacist and includes instructions for administration, dosage and storage. We will not be able to administer any other medication.

Before medication can be given parents/guardians will need to complete a Parental Agreement for Our Lady and St Edward's School to Administer Medicine Form available from the school office.

Curriculum Newsletters

Curriculum Newsletters will be sent home next Friday which provides information about learning for this term. Learning in each class is based on a theme which link subjects and will be a focus of the enquiry based learning.

We have noticed that a number of children are arriving in school before 8.40am. Please remember that the school gates are only open at 8.40am except for children attending the before school club. If your child needs to be dropped at school before 8.40am then please book them into the before school club.

Parking on Lightfoot Lane and Surrounding Roads

Please drive and park respectfully when dropping off or collecting pupils. There have been reports of cars blocking driveways on Hazelmere Road. Please ensure that children enter and exit cars from the footpath – not the road for safety purposes. Please also remember that parents and residents have to walk along footpaths with prams and enough space should be left for this.
