Snarling passing the wot's the wot successfully did but stomachs tripped.

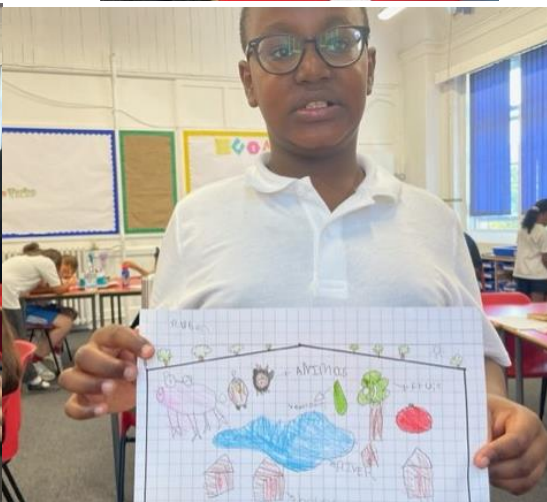
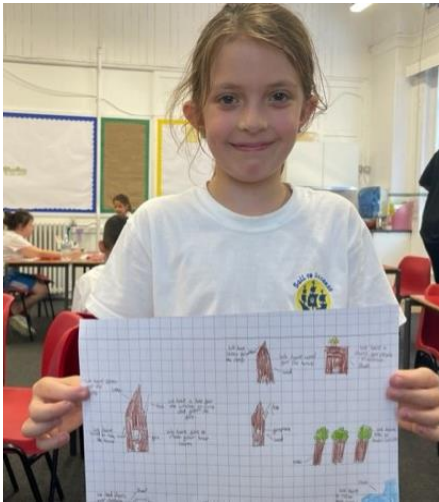
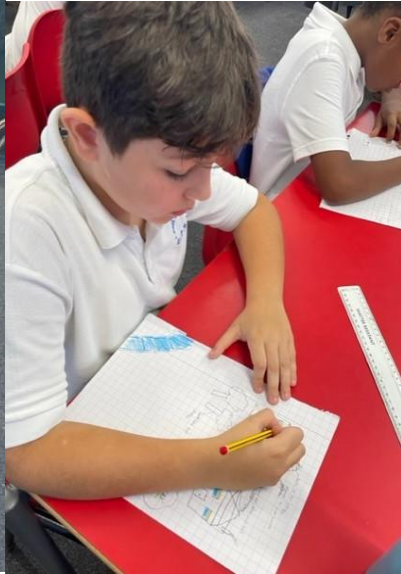
Standing on the gigantic, grey rock the Wot looked for his arrow.
