The award recognises a school's achievement in putting the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child into practice within the school and beyond. Every week, one child from each class receives a Rights Respecting award with a certificate and badge to take home.



Here are the Rights Respecting stars for this half term.

Give a helping hand to those who need it.	Article 23 - A child with a disability has the right to live a full and decent life with dignity and independence, and to play an active part in the community.
Use kind words to those around them.	Article 19 - Governments must do all that they can to ensure children are protected from all forms of violence, abuse, neglect and bad treatment....
Keep the classroom clean and tidy.	Article 24 - Every child has the right to the best possible health... work to provide... clean water, nutritious food and a clean environment so that children can stay healthy.
Ensure your behaviour in class promotes a good learning environment.	Article 28 - Every child has the right to an education.
Refer to the UN rights in classroom discussions and in your work.	Article 42 (knowledge of rights) Governments must actively work to make sure children and adults know about the Convention.
To contribute to class discussions using information you have researched or read about.	Article 17 (access to information from the media) Every child has the right to reliable information from a variety of sources, and governments should encourage the media to provide information that children can understand. Governments must help protect children from materials that could harm them.
Always cover your mouth when yawning or coughing and throw tissues away when you have used them	Article 24 - Every child has the right to the best possible health...

The Rights Respecting ambassadors meet with Miss Winskill regularly and help to organise and promote charity events.





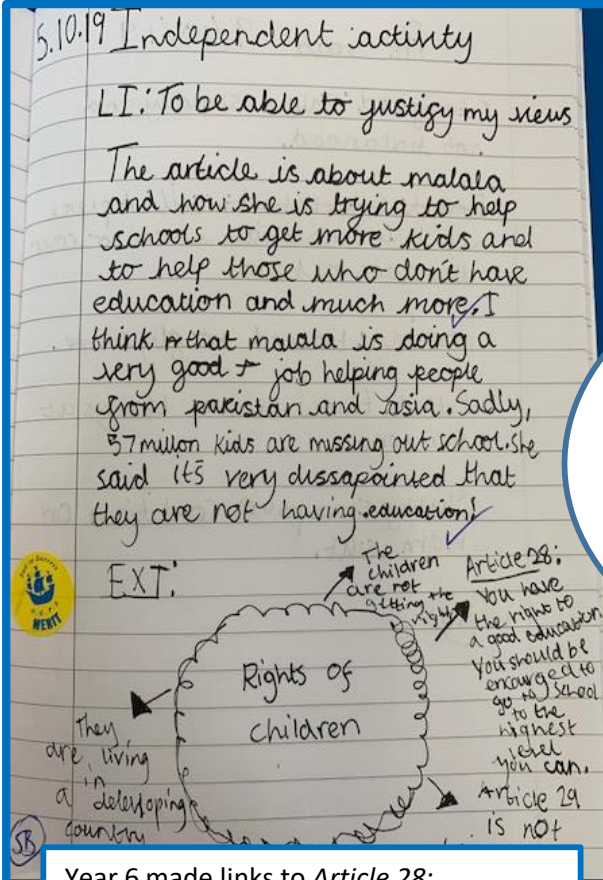
Foundation stage made their role play area into a hospital and talked about
