### A message from the CEO



MARK JORDAN

It is with great pride and gratitude that I write to you in admiration with how we collectively responded and met the many challenges that the pandemic brought throughout this academic year. The impact your individual and collective actions have had on pupils, families and the local community has been fantastic and whilst we are not quite returning to how life was 18 months ago, at least now we can start to look forward to enjoying some sort of rest and recouperation over the summer as we enter a stage of further relaxation of the restrictions that we have been living with recently.

In the last newsletter I informed you of some of the ways we have strengthened the PLT Board, I am happy to update further and confirm that we have appointed Neville Diffey not only as a new Trustee but as Chair of the PLT Board. Below is his profile which I am sure you will agree places him with the necessary skills and experiences to lead the Trust Board.

Neville Diffey: Chair of PLT Board & Member - Neville is a Solicitor, having trained in London and practised in both London and Hong Kong. He specialised in company law, developing particular expertise in mergers and acquisitions, financial services and corporate governance. After private practice, Neville first joined a global investment bank and became a Managing Director in the Legal Department and, subsequently, was a Managing Director in the Compliance Department of another investment bank with wide-ranging and extensive responsibilities for the Investment Banking Business and across many functions of the department. Most recently, Neville worked in the Compliance Department and the Chief Controls Office of a universal bank. Neville has broad expertise in risk management, regulation, governance, M&A, conduct, and change management. He has operated as an advisor and as a consultant as well as in governance/oversight roles. Neville has a Master's Degree in Law from Gonville & Caius College, Cambridge. Neville has assumed his post as of 26th May 2021 and subsequently Ceri Howells (profile below) will step down as Acting chair and resume her substantive position as Vice Chair of the PLT Board. I would like to thanks Ceri for her unwavering commitment and insight for the 6 months that she undertook the additional responsibility, her actions during this time galvanised the Trust Board and guided us through a period of transition. I am sure you can see that the addition of Ceri and Neville working in collaboration as Chair and Vice Chair is a real coup for PLT.

**Ceri Howells: Vice Chair of PLT Board** - Ceri is a CIMA qualified accountant and has over 25 years accounting experience across Mining, Media and Logistics with over 18 years at Anglo American PLC. Ceri's roles have primarily focused on forecasting and analysing results to provide decision supportive information to senior Executives and the Board as well as Finance Transformation and Savings Projects. Ceri has a degree in Mathematical Studies from Goldsmiths, University of London. As you are aware the last 12 months have been somewhat of a challenge to us all both locally and nationally, with education being one of the many sectors that have been most severely effected by the pandemic. During the last 6 months work has undergone reviewing the previous vision and strategic development plan to inform a new version which will be shared with you in the Autumn term.

This new strategic plan will provide the roadmap for the next 3 years and ensure that the Trust continues to build on the current successes and also outline what the PLT Board and Executive Leaders feel is the next steps for the Trust over the next 3 year period. I am excited to confirm that the Ramsden Hall Academy build programme successfully completed in mid-April and now the academy has moved into what can only be described as 'State of the art' facilities in both the education and residential aspects of the academy as you can see from the images below.



As previously stated the Trust has recently completed a review and a key aspect of this was the structure of the Central Team and this will also look very different from September with some additional posts being created to delegate strategic responsibility and help create additional leadership opportunities for aspiring or current leaders across the organisation. The posts that will be advertised are for additional responsibility to one's current role and not 'stand alone' new posts. ### **Central Trust Updates**

#### Update from our IT Team

It has been business as usual for the IT Team, as we remain busy supporting the Trust, staff, and students at sites. The team continues to aid remote learning during the COVID period as sometimes staff and students have to suddenly go into isolation. On a brighter note, the Ramsden Hall Academy new build is now complete with a brand new, high-performing scalable network infrastructure deployed. Special thanks to the IT Team for their contributions and for taking the project over the line. Keith Richards our ICT Strategic Operations Manager has done a sterling job in acquiring 8 top-of-the-range servers, keyboards & mice from Wolseley UK as a donation. The IT team have upgraded Wandle Valley Academy's Wifi solution to Ubiquiti UniFi to improve performance. Legacy equipment across all sites has been recycled accordingly and certified. The IT Team continues to support Chromebooks alongside our native Windows environment which remains robust across all our academies.



Englantin Muca - Deputy Head & Teaching and Learning Lead for Victory Park Academy Our focus for summer term has been ensuring that our year 11 pupils leave with the right qualifications that they deserve. To support this, all subjects from each academy were Internally Quality Assured across the Trust. The focus was on year 11 only, due to non-exams which was replaced with coursework. Each teacher was required to bring at least 4 pieces of marked work. Using PLT moderation template teachers moderated the selection of work. This provided each subject, in each academy with moderated evidence if required by exam boards and reassured teachers of the grading. This external moderation reinforced the high standard of marking and grading work across Trust and allowed teachers to see other tasks; work completed for different exam boards; sharing good practice; Teaching and Learning ideas of assessments and tasks elsewhere.

Due to the success of these moderations, we have now planned to have 3 per year subject network meetings across the Trust. Each subject will have their own agenda and these will be more effective as they are spread across the year. From this moderation, subjects including English are now following the same exam boards which will make moderation; schemes of work and planning more in sync as a Trust. Review of the curriculum for next academic year has also been our focus review supported by the Director of Teaching and Learning for the Trust. As a result of the moderation meetings and the curriculum reviews, the academies will all be offering the same qualifications with the same exam boards for the following subjects: NCFE Sports; PHSE as an attainment: AQA English Language GCSE; NCFE Food Technology and Prince's Trust. Additionally, 2 days of remote learning will continue in September 2021/2022 due to the success of engaging particular pupils and to be fully prepared should another Covid lockdown occur. Another focal point has been the 'effective use of data and data analysis' to support and enhance staff professional development. A CPD provided the necessary reminders and for some, new information on how to decipher the academy's GO4Schools data, analyse it for purpose and use this within their teaching and planning. The next academic year will focus on further CPD training to develop and support staff professional development. A CPD calendar has been created as a result of the discussions and decisions made by academy's head teachers; Trust Executive staff and other senior leaders. It utilises experienced and specialised staff to deliver CPD's in their area of expertise, therefore sharing good practice. Some of the CPD's are mandatory; others staff can join or will be advised to join such as ECT's or LSA's where relevant.

Corinne Gould - Personal Assistant to CEO, GDPR Lead and HR Officer

This term I have continued to work on Governance Recruitment for the Trust Board and Local Academy Councils. I have continued to organise interviews for candidates virtually due to the current situation and we have been successful at adding a range of additional skills to both central and local governance. In order to ensure that the new Trustees were able to assimilate into the organisation quickly I created a Trustee welcome pack which had a range of key documents and liaised with IT and core staff to ensure they were ready to support the trust from day 1. This term I have completed 121 meetings with all Data Protection Assistants in the Academies. Audits have been completed for all Academies, and the GDPR online system we use has proven a really useful tool in keeping all the information we need to know about how and where data is stored, ensuring that the Trust and Academies continue to be compliant. The Data Protection assistants have worked hard to complete the Audit and any actions were completed. They have also worked hard in ensuring all staff are trained on the same system in regards to GDPR, so there is consistent training across the Trust and Academies of how to store and keep data secure. Feedback meetings were scheduled and completed, and I am really pleased with the Audits this year. A key development of my role this year has been that I have supported the CEO with all restructure and legal matters. Earlier in the year I completed an accredited course and am now have assumed the responsibility for Company Secretary, assisting with various aspects of company registration and compliance. I have also completed the HR Diploma course in the early summer and I am looking forward to using all that I have learned whilst working alongside the current HR provider.

It has been another busy and exciting term at PLT! I have been working with the Academies on a number of key HR areas, one of them being personnel files. I have visited all of the Academies to audit their files to ensure that they have all key documents within them ready for our audit. Another key area of focus for me over this academic year has been building outstanding working relationships with our Senior Admin/HR Staff through holding half termly 121 meetings with all of them and arranging regular group catch-up's and training sessions. Policy has been another key area for me as our new HR providers have been reviewing our current policies and procedures and will be feeding back to us over the Summer, ready for September.

Another exciting point to add is that I successfully completed my CIPD Foundation Diploma in HR Practice. I have been digging a bit deeper with the use of Twitter and different ways that we can raise engagement. Corona virus has brought with it an added workload and their flexibility in regards to this workload has been key to the continuous opening of our sites wherever possible. Monitoring of temperatures, twice weekly lateral flow tests, the disinfection of the sites on a daily basis and the electrostatic cleaning when we have been faced with positive test results has all had to be addressed. As a Trust we will continue to follow all government and Public Health England guidelines and will be monitoring all of our sites. The maintenance and improvements to our sites is ongoing with Sutton House Academy and Victory Park Academy having works performed to the site security in the form of additional maglocks fitted to gates,

monitoring screens and fencing. This has improved site security with a view on safeguarding. We have installed new climbing apparatus as well as new goals in the front playground. Park Campus Academy is having extensive roof works which will have concluded by the end of term and the new vegetable patch has been harvested a few times now and all produce has been well received and put to good use by Maureen in the kitchen. The pupil entrance has been decorated to freshen it up and a large window in the entrance lobby it in the process of being replaced. At Ramsden Hall the newly built teaching and residential buildings are now being put to full use. New furniture has been bought and erected throughout the buildings. Pupils have settled into the residential building well and the feedback I have heard has only been positive.
