### Important - Please Read

Finally, please could we ask that younger children are supervised on the playground and that they do not chase the chickens, as it does scare them and we encourage the children to be kind to animals. Thank you.

- Parents/Carers need to stay near to their child for the whole session


The training will go ahead irrespective of the weather and the children need to bring a drink with them.
