## English:

Skills taught at home - multiplication, division, statistics, length

- Division and multiplication problems linked to text applying skills.
- Surveys to consolidate tally charts, pictograms and bar charts - favourite circus snack, results from Science investigation.
- Practical measurement tasks link to Science distance people can jump.

Link to text: What type of land use is a circus?


#### Science:
