Next week's Picture News topic is

'Are there some jobs robots could never do?'



A new robot called Digit, designed to be humanlike and capable of lifting and moving items, is being tested in warehouses of the online retailer, Amazon. The robot is in its first few weeks of trials at Amazon's facility in Seattle, USA, as the company tries to improve automation in its processes. To begin with, the robot is being taught to pick up and move empty boxes to ensure that they are ready for reuse. The yellow boxes, or totes, are used throughout the company's fulfilment process.

Digit is able to walk on two legs. This key feature, which gives the robot the ability to move over different terrains and up steps as found in human environments, could be particularly useful for Amazon. The robot is not yet able to perform more sophisticated tasks, such as identifying items that need to be picked out of boxes for packing.

Things to talk about at home:

- Do you think that robots will be used more and more in workplaces and homes? If so, what do you feel they will be used for? Why?
- Make a list of jobs that you think robots would be good at and a list of those that you think people will always be needed for.
