'Can anyone break a world record?'



The tree at the centre of the world-famous 'Sycamore Gap' on Hadrian's Wall, England, has reportedly been deliberately felled on the night of 28 September and was discovered by walkers the next morning. The National Trust said it was 'shocked and saddened' by the felling of the tree, which won English Tree of the Year in 2016. They confirmed that the tree had been 'deliberately felled' overnight. Currently, it is not known how or why the tree was cut down.

The stump of the tree remains healthy and could be used to grow new shoots Andrew Poad from the National Trust has said. Though others, including Rob Ternent, head gardener at the Alnwick Garden in Northumberland, warned the beauty spot will never be the same again.

The Sycamore Gap tree is an estimated 300 year old sycamore tree, which stood alongside Hadrian's Wall near Crag Lough in Northumberland, England. It was located in a dip in the landscape and was always a very popular photographic subject, often described as one of the most photographed trees in the country.
