The Picture News topic for next week is ...

'Is it important to have a morning routine?'



750 schools in England have been chosen to trial free daily breakfast clubs, to see whether they could work for all schools. Starting in April, the schools will provide breakfast and activities for children. Schools are encouraged to offer healthy, varied and nutritious breakfasts such as wheat cereals, porridge, fresh fruit and yoghurt, as well as activities including educational puzzles, reading and crafts.

The government-funded pilot scheme will see the 750 chosen schools opening at least 30 minutes before the start of the school day. Many are excited about the idea, however, some people are worried that the money the government is offering (so that the breakfast clubs are free) may not be enough to pay for all the food and activities as is the case with the Universal Infant Free School Meals programme (which gives children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 school meals for free), where schools have to fund the shortfall from the school budget.

Things to talk about at home:

- * Have you attended a breakfast club? Would you like to?
- * What do you like to have for breakfast? What about others at home?
- * Share your morning routine with someone and ask about theirs. Do you feel it's important to have a routine? Why?
