Mrs. Quigley's weekly message:

Happy Friday! This week has been busy in school with Parent's Evenings as well as the usual busy school life. It's been lovely to see so many of you on Monday and Wednesday and I know the teachers valued being able to share feedback around your child's learning. Thank you to the parents who were able to provide feedback on the questionnaire too. I am pleased to say that 100% of you said your children feel safe in school and also that we support your child's mental health and wellbeing. I will share further outcomes in the following weeks, but as ever if you do ever wish to raise a query or speak to a staff member about concerns, we have a number of options. These include: Seesaw private messaging to class staff and the office, popping into the office to see one of the ladies in there, speaking to me or another staff member on the gate, or raising a general query via Parent Forum.

Following feedback from Parent Forum, we have been working hard to try and make our club allocation run a little easier for everyone. Therefore we are going to open club booking for a period of 2 weeks. As we have such a large clubs offer, the administration side takes quite a bit of work and the office need at least a week before the holidays to organise. By closing the club booking after 2 weeks, this will allow the office chance to organise the registers and ensure that staff are aware of who will be joining them. The bookings will open on Monday 4 March and close on Sunday 17 March. Please can you support the office and understand the time frames in place. If your child has previously attended an over subscribed club, you won't be able to make a booking currently whilst we allow other children to attend. Thank you for your support with these changes.

We have our HPL associate visiting next week to continue our work with us. From the parents questionnaires, I can see that many of you are interested in a workshop to find out more. I will speak with Mark next week and hopefully we can organise something during the next term. I will also look into this being recorded for our parents.

Across the UK and Ireland, the charity, World Book Day, will be holding its annual celebration on Thursday 7 March. The day is a chance to celebrate and encourage reading in schools and homes.
