A 23-year-old British climber has become the youngest woman to summit the world's highest mountains. Adriana Brownlee reached the 8027m peak of Shishapangma in Tibet, at around 8 am on Wednesday 9 October. She is only the second Briton to complete the feat, after quitting university to begin a career in mountaineering.

Adriana grew up in South West London. From a young age, Adriana had the dream of becoming a successful climber. Climbing Mount Everest had been the fulfilment of a childhood dream for Adriana. When she was 9 years old, she wrote in her school homework ...

"I would like to be famous for climbing the highest mountain in the world ... and be one of the youngest girls to do this. To achieve my goal, I would have to train very hard every day running to get very fit.
