The Picture News topic for next week is ...

'Will classrooms of the future be teacherless?'



The UK's first teacherless classroom, using Al (artificial intelligence) instead of human teachers, has opened. David Game College, a school in London, began its new course for twenty GCSE pupils in September. The pupils will learn using both Al platforms on their computers and VR (virtual reality) headsets.

The AI will make tailored lessons for each pupil, enhancing their strengths and developing their weaknesses, so they get a special learning experience. For example, if you are good at maths but find English hard, your lessons would provide extra support where you need it.

Three learning coaches will be present in the classroom for behaviour management, to offer support and to teach subjects that AI isn't as effective at (for example, art lessons).

Things to talk about at home:

- What do you imagine it would be like to learn without a teacher? What difficulties do you think might arise? What do you believe the benefits could be?
- What qualities do you think make a good teacher? Ask others at home. Do you agree on all of the qualities?
