# 'Do world leaders have a duty to help other countries?'



World Leaders from around twenty countries are creating a group or 'coalition'. According to UK Prime Minister, Sir Keir Starmer, they will work together to support Ukraine and Russia. The new group setup follows a difficult meeting between Ukraine's President, Volodymyr Zelensky, and US President, Donald Trump. The two leaders argued and the meeting ended without a solution.

Since Russia invaded Ukraine in 2022, President Zelensky has had many meetings with leaders from around the world, hoping to end the war. Since the meeting with Donald Trump, Zelensky has met with leaders in Europe, who have said they offer their full support to Zelensky and Ukraine.

About 20 countries are interested in joining a 'coalition of the willing', which means the countries agree to work together with the same goal. In this case, that is to support Ukraine during the war, for example by sending troops to act as peacekeepers.

Things to talk about at home:

- \* Share your knowledge of world leaders and talk to others at home about theirs.
- In your opinion, how important is it for world leaders to work together? In what areas do you think they need to work together?
- \* What about their role in helping other countries - do you feel this is always important?
