#### 'How can you make your voice heard?'



In countries across Europe, including Romania, Belgium, Hungary, Poland and Greece, tractors have been blocking city streets and motorways as farmers protest against certain European Union (EU) rules. Their concerns include falling incomes, rising red tape and competition from imports. Both national governments and the EU are under pressure to stop the demonstrations. One protesting farmer, Hygo Auge from France, told news reporters for CNN that the current system 'makes a mockery of both farmers and consumers'.

Some of the concerns of the French farmers, such as lots of extra paperwork, only apply to them and not other countries. Other concerns that apply to other nations include the increasing cost of fuel and animal feed, cheaper food coming in from other countries and the high cost of electricity.

- Talk about the actions that farmers across the EU are taking and why you think they chose to block roads as one of their actions

# Attendance Update

As a parent, it can be difficult to know when to send your child into school if they are feeling unwell or mildly anxious, but finding solutions is a team effort between schools, parents and children, and there is support and information available to help you make the best decision for your child. If you have any concerns or would like support, you can speak to your class teacher, Mrs Quigley (who is usually available on one of the gates each morning) or by speaking to the school office, who will pass on any concerns.

Regular school attendance can help healthy relationships with other children, which is a protective factor for mental health and wellbeing.

It's usually safe for parents and carers to send their children to school with mild illnesses, like a minor cough, runny nose or sore throat, however, children should stay at home if they have a high temperature of 38C or above. The guidance is also that your child should stay off school for 48 hours after the last bout of sickness or diarrhoea. If you are unsure, you can check the NHS website <u>www.nhs.uk/livewell/is-my-child-too-ill-for-school/</u> or, again, contact the school office, who will be happy to help.
