### Mrs. Quigley's weekly message:

This week we have had our first 2 day visit from Mark at HPL. Following a tour of the school, where he was very impressed with how focused the children were in their lessons, he spent time in a couple of classes getting to know us as a school and know the children. He left with a collection of hand made items from Reception, and in amazement at the attitude of our Year 6 children. Across school teachers are working with the children to explore perseverance. They have been thinking about what this means, how to persevere and how we can overcome obstacles. Assemblies this week have focused around that and we have heard some great examples of this today for our Golden Planet Award.

Our Y6 HPL Ambassadors have also this week delivered planet displays to every classroom. This is so that teachers can recognise children who have demonstrated our HPL value, currently perseverance, by adding their name to the planets lesson by lesson. They met with Mark and shared their work so far, along with their plans. Again he was very impressed with their thinking and maturity.

Over the next 18 months, Mark will be visiting every month and spending time with the teachers and children and supporting us to continue to develop, and to embed the mindset of 'everyone can'. I know this approach will support the children so much, especially when sometimes they face challenges, as they will learn the wide range of skills needed to strive toward being the very best version of themselves.

Finally, thank you to those parents who have been using the car park this week. I know that our local PCSO has visited and provided some advice, and will continue to do this to support. Let's all work together to make school drop off and pick up the safest it can be.

## Scarlet Fever/Slapped Cheek

We have had a case of Scarlet Fever reported in school and it is important that you are aware of the symptoms below - full details can be found at <https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/scarlet-fever/>.

- The first signs of scarlet fever can be flu-like symptoms, including a high temperature, a sore throat and swollen neck glands (a large lump on the side of your neck)
- A rash appears 12 to 48 hours later. It looks like small, raised bumps and starts on the chest and tummy, then spreads. The rash makes your skin feel rough, like sandpaper
- On white skin the rash looks pink or red. On brown and black skin it might be harder to see a change in colour, but you can still feel the rash and see the raised bumps
- A white coating also appears on the tongue. This peels, leaving the tongue red, swollen and covered in little bumps (called "strawberry tongue")

There has also been a number of cases of **slapped cheek** in school, it has similar symptoms but it is important that you contact anyone who is pregnant that you may have been in contact with as they will need to consult with their midwife if less than 20 weeks pregnant. ### Additional reminders:

- \* Bobbles/hair ties should be appropriate to school
- \* Long hair should be tied up at all times
- \* No jewellery should be worn, although children with pierced ears may wear studs. On PE days, we would prefer it that earrings are not worn at all, if they are worn, you will need to provide tape to cover the earrings. Please note that earrings MUST not be worn for swimming and your child should not wear them to school on these days.

#### **What are our donations spent on?**

In the short, yes this is a option however since our events are for 200+ people at a time there is a charge to use the platform. We try to keep costs of events at a minimum so to use a platform like this we are increasing our event costs. If this is something our community would be happy to fund and put in place then I would be happy to explore the option further.

#### **The fairs worked better through the week**

Whilst I am unsure of how much of an audience had this opinion, I just want to express the overwhelmingly positive feedback we received from our Christmas Fair held on a Saturday, not only from our families but also stall holders, the wider community and our visitors. Although a fair through the week is a shorter event and therefore less time consuming all round, it is also extremely limiting for us in the winter. We wouldn't be able to have the stall holders, the visiting vocalist or the special guest appearances. All of these I feel added great value to our event. At a glance, neither stands out as the better option fundraising wise, as the amount raised is similar. After trying events both through the week and at the weekend, I've come to understand that we simply just can't please everyone, all at once... I really wish we could.
