Idling Cars/Health Issues

As you may be aware, idling cars emit hazardous pollutants, which lead to climate change and health issues - in particular to Asthma sufferers. Did you know that turning your engine off for that ten-minute waiting period could prevent 450 grams of carbon dioxide from being released? That could make a huge difference to the air quality around school this includes on the road outside school and the car parks either side of the Tim Parry recreation grounds.

Anti-idling experiments around London schools saw levels of black carbon - a pollutant associated with car exhausts - drop by 36% after "no idling" action days. Just imagine what a difference such behaviour would make if implemented across the entire school year! Many idlers argue that turning your engine off and on again actually causes higher levels of pollution, but this is only the case if you're restarting your car within a minute or less. If you're waiting for longer than 60 seconds, please do remember to switch off your engines to help our children and the environment.
