A Note From Your Chair



Warrington

I am delighted to welcome you to the Autumn edition of our Newsletter. My team are all volunteers, each of us are carers for our own children and young people with Special Educational Needs. Like you we have that lived experience which makes us passionate about what we do, making sure that your young people live their best lives with great outcomes. We work tirelessly on your behalf across Education, Health, Social Care and other partners across Warrington, the North-West and Nationally.

WarrPAC are currently involved in 23 workstreams, the most impactful being the SEND Board Chaired by the Director of Children's Services where we can bring your voice to the highest level of decision making. Other workstreams include the Neurodevelopment Pathway Board led by health and Clinical Commissioners, this encompasses waiting lists, communication, lack of OT's, equipment and everything in the middle. We have met with senior staff from the CDC around waiting times, suggesting and coproducing a letter for families informing them of long-awaited results. We knew there was a shortage of consultants so we asked them to email/post out a result letter initially as a much quicker process than waiting for a face-to-face appointment. This is now part of their clinical practice. You told us Communication with families is a massive issue so we have held those teams to account telling them it needs to be better and how to improve. Meeting and challenging the transport team on the annual issu especially at the start of a new academic year. We have been instrumental in challenging parental costings around post 19 transport very recently after being approached by parent/carers. We are also in a great position to deliver the positive comments that we ad from over 60 families who contacted us in crisis during COVID, whose cases we were able to take directly to Education, Health and Social Care who stepped up with positive outcomes for all of them.

The LA and Health Services are doing some great work behind the scenes in the most challenging times financially for SEND so it is vital we we ork together as a community to ind smart solutions. Whilst we have a good working relationship with the LA and health e are independent of them and very much a critical fri end. We challenge them withou dice on your behalf to ensure your voice is heard at the highest level so we can things for the better. We hear you and I can assure you chan

During the pandemic we also met regularly with the local authority and by working together we supported 75 families facing individual issues, to achieve positive outcomes. We are incredibly proud that we could support those families at such a critical time and would like to express our gratitude to the professionals who went over and above to reach a positive resolution for those families.
