
Value of the half term: Co-operation

Finally, thank you to Mrs Gemmell who donned her apron to make her delicious cakes!








Picture News

This year marks the 67th edition of the competition and 37 countries have chosen to compete for the famous, lifechanging trophy. The city of Liverpool will be hosting this year's event and it's thought that more than 160 million people will be watching!

The Eurovision Song Contest is an annual singing competition, organised by the European Broadcasting Union. The competition started in 1956 and gathers performers, selected at the national level by each participating country, from across Europe.
