## Mrs. Quigley's weekly message:

### Unique Individuals Learning Together

Thank you to all our parents who were able to attend parents evening this week. I know the teachers enjoyed the opportunity to discuss the children's progress and next steps. If you have missed your appointment, teachers will reach out to book you back in as it is important for us to work in partnership with you for your child's education.

Last week a group of Year 5 and 6 children represented the school in a Quicksticks tournament. I'm delighted to say that they came fourth. Miss Harding and Mr Hirst (one of our Governors) attended the event and were so impressed with the attitudes of the children as well as the determination and sportsmanship shown by our children. Most of all, they were impressed with how they supported each other - demonstrating our Park Road value of respect through kindness.

World Book Day has been enjoyed across school today and we have seen a wonderful array of costumes along with children wearing clothes they feel comfortable in for reading. Teachers have enjoyed reading for pleasure with the children and the hall has been filled with a buzz around books during these sessions, organised by Mrs Roberts. Mrs Roberts has given each class their book vouchers, which can be used in exchange for a World Book Day book in the shops or for £1 off the cost of other books, including if you visit our book fair in a few weeks (don't forget to bring your voucher along on the day). The fair arrives on Monday 16 March and will be open each day after school. We do hope you can support us, as school receive a percentage of the sales back to use to buy books.

Finally, I have asked teachers to remind all the children about the size of book bags. As you know we are a small school - something that actually is a strength for us in a lot of ways - but one thing we don't have is excess space. I have noticed in some year groups children are bringing in rucksacks or larger bags and we do not have the storage space for these. Please can you support by only using a bag that is book bag sized - I have added the measurements on the next page for your information.

## **Clubs - Summer 1 - please read carefully**

Details of the after school clubs on offer for next half term can be found below. The clubs will be available to book via Parentpay.

The clubs will be published from Monday (please bear with us as we fit this into our working days) and registration will close at 9 am on Monday 23 March. Please bear in mind that the clubs are popular with limited availability and are often booked up within a couple of days.

Please only sign up if you can attend each week as there will be no refunds if your child is unable to attend a session and **please take care when booking as we are unable to refund mistakes** - school pays a fee for every transaction (both payment to us and for refunds).

**IMPORTANT SAFEGUARDING REQUEST:** If a child can't stay for a club, **please remember to let the OFFICE know in advance** (not the class staff) so that the registers can be updated and your child will be able to leave as usual rather than going to the club. The office has to follow up any child not attending a club (where they haven't been notified in advance) to ensure they are safe and it could delay them identifying a serious safeguarding issue if they have a lot of children to follow up.

Finally, **please make a note of the clubs you book** and of **the pick up details below** as a reminder (perhaps take a photograph so you have it available on your phone as reference) - you can always look on the Weekly Updates on Seesaw or our website if you do lose it. All clubs run from 3.15 - 4.15 pm and don't forget to let the person picking up know which gate they need to collect from.
