### **Picture News**

The Picture News topic for next week is ...

'How can we make connections with others?'



The Princess of Wales has recently shared pictures, drawn by herself, Prince George, Princess Charlotte and Prince Louis, of each other. The artworks, shared on social media, are part of the Shaping Us campaign, which highlights how we develop skills to connect with others from a young age. The pictures also aim to raise awareness of an exhibition, launched by the Princess, at the National Portrait Gallery in London, encouraging children to explore their relationships and feelings.

'Shaping Us' is a new long-term campaign from The Royal Foundation Centre for Early Childhood, which aims to transform the issue from one of scientific interest to one of the most strategically important topics of our time. This follows on from research conducted last year highlighting that very few people recognise the unique importance of the 0 -5 period compared to other stages of life, more details can be found at

The total cost of the club depends on the number of weeks the club is running. Please only sign up if you can attend each week as there will be no refunds if your child is unable to attend a session - any refunds for external clubs should be requested directly to the club provider. There is no charge for Choir but we do ask that your child commits to attending every week. **Please take care when booking as we are unable to refund mistakes.**



## Doorstep crime





This time of year, you may have an increase in cold callers offering services such as gardening or home improvements and the Police want to help keep you safe from bogus callers and doorstep thieves. Doorstep cold calling is not illegal; however, Trading Standards advice is to NEVER employ traders who call at your door. The work or service offered can sometimes be unnecessary, overpriced, of a poor standard or not done at all. Sometimes, they have no formal training to carry out the work offered, and some may have links with distraction burglaries.

#### Protect yourself by:

- \* Keeping your doors locked
  - ⇒ Offenders sometimes work together one keeps you distracted at the front of the house whilst the other enters via the back door.
  - ⇒ If you are not sure who is at your door, don't open it! Speak to unannounced visitors through a window if possible.
- \* Bogus callers invade personal space and intimidate people to gain entry. Do not feel obliged to answer to any unwanted visitors, you can choose not to engage.
- \* Don't be drawn in by stories which create panic, some callers might ask you to contact the emergency service as there has been an incident. If this happens assist them with the door closed.
- \* Telephone a neighbour or friend to come and check out the visitor before opening the door. Letting an unexpected visitor know that you have support coming to assist will often deter people with malicious intentions.
- \* Ask for ID and call the company the visitor claims to be from. i.e. utilities: call a number you already have on your bill or from a directory. If they are a genuine caller, they won't mind you completing these checks. Never ring a telephone or mobile number the bogus caller provides!
- \* If you're still not sure, ask the visitor to leave and tell them to make a written appointment so you can arrange for someone to be with you for the pre-arranged appointment.
- \* Consider joining a Neighbourhood watch scheme in your area www.cheshirenw.org This is a great way to build a sense of community and encourage neighbours to look out for each other.
- \* You can arrange with service providers a personal password should they need to make a house call to you i.e. gas, water or electricity. You can find the information on how to set this up on your bill, if not give them a call to arrange this.
- \* If you feel threatened at any time or feel you are in immediate danger, call 999. If you suspect a bogus caller has visited you, even if you did not let them in, call the Police on 101, we need to know!

### **REMEMBER – It is your door, and you are in control of how you handle visitors.**

Don't be afraid to ask for support from family and friends if you are unsure of an unexpected visitor or you have home improvement work planned. Friends and family would rather help to keep you safe with some quick checks.

### Fraud/scam awareness

- \* Don't forget, the police or banks will NEVER ask you to withdraw or transfer money over the phone (no matter how convincing they are).
- \* IF SOMETHING IS TO GOOD TO BE TRUE IT PROBABLY IS
- \* If you are at a cash machine or bank when withdrawing money please take a look around you and make sure nobody is watching you. If you feel like you have been followed from a bank or cash machine if possible go back into the bank or into a shop and inform staff.
- \* If your card is swallowed at a cash machine it could be that the machine has been tampered with. You can call your bank direct from machine and block your cards straight away, if you call 159 on any phone you can get in touch with any bank securely (a computerised voice will ask what bank you require and will put you through to whichever you bank with).


