Picture News

Each week in school, we use Picture News, a resources which provides a current news story, an image and a thought-provoking question. Every Friday, we will let you know the topic for the following week so that you can explore the topic with your child - there are even some helpful hints at the end of the article.

Next week's Picture News topic is

'Should lifejackets be compulsory for all on open water?'



In Canada, the government in the province of Ontario is set to pass a new law that will make it compulsory for children aged 12 and under to wear lifejackets on boats. Parents, guardians or other adults supervising children could be subject to a fine of up to \$200 (£130) if they do not comply. In the UK, currently, there is no legal requirement for anyone using rivers and seas for leisure purposes to wear a lifejacket/personal flotation device (PFD).

Things to talk about at home:

- * Share your experience of lifejackets. Have you ever been required to wear one? Where were you? Did everyone wear them?
- * Can you make a list of all the times you think lifejackets should be worn?
- * Do you feel there should be laws in place to ensure people wear lifejackets on boats at sea? If so, do you believe they should apply to everyone?


Attendance

Regular attendance at school is important for both your child's education and for settling into school. The beginning of a school term or year is particularly an important time for children to settle in to their class and understand any new routines or topics. It is also a time where children may make new friends or re-establish their previous friendship groups. Sometimes young children may find it difficult to get back into their friendship groups after a break so consistent attendance can help to minimise this.

The school year has 190 days for pupils to attend a year and each day that is missed unnecessarily has an impact on their education. Please remember that there are 175 days per year when your child does not have to attend school so please plan any routine appointments etc for during this time. The 175 days can be used to:

- Attend routine appointments eg dentist
- Spend time together
- Go on family visits
- Visit friends and family
- * Go on holiday
- Go shopping
- Go on days out

It is not only the number of days that your child is in school that matters but **Every Minute Counts:** If you arrive late to school everyday, your child's learning begins to suffer. This graph shows how being late to school everyday over a school year adds up to lost learning time. Arriving on time allows your child to settle into the school day along with their classmates.



We know how busy everyone is over the summer and thought the following reminders might be useful:

Dinners and Snacks

Please remember to keep your Parentpay accounts topped up if your child has snacks or if your child is in KS2 and has a meal from the school kitchen. Meals and snacks should be paid for when they are taken—school cannot afford to offer credit. If you do forget to top up, we will send you a reminder through Seesaw. If you do receive a reminder, please do top up straight away or reply to let us know if there are any problems as we can only help if we are aware of it. Thank you.

Data Collection Sheets

We will be sending out our data collection sheets for you to check. These sheets are **extremely important should we need to contact you in case of an emergency**. Please check all of your child's and your details and notify us of any changes or confirm that nothing has changed on the sheet, sign it and return it to school

Permission to Pick Up

If you want to make any changes to the people that you have given permission to be able to pick up your child to school, please send a Seesaw message or email the office, office@prps.omegamat.co.uk, with your child's name, year and the changes you would like to make.

Chicken/Guinea Pig Rota

We will shortly be sending out a request for help to care for our Chickens and Guinea Pigs over the weekends and holidays. If you are available at all and willing to check on, feed and water our animals, let out the chickens and possibly clean them out, please keep an eye out on Seesaw for a forms link so that you can let us know when you would be available to help. Full training will be given and you can keep any eggs that are laid during your duty!!

Absence Reporting

Please remember to let the school office know by 9.15 am if your child is going to be absent for any reason. There are many ways to let us know: via option 1 on our telephone line 01925 723 550, via our website, via Seesaw or via the school email (office@prps.omegamat.co.uk). The office emails are constantly monitored whereas a specific teacher may be off or unable to access their account during teaching time. Thank you.

Labelling Clothing

Each year, we have large amounts of lost property that we are unable to return to children because they are not labelled with the child's name. Please help us to return items to your children by clearly naming them - it is even more important with the increase in living expenses that we can do this.

Dropping Off/Picking Up

Please could we ask that you do not walk through the staff car park and that you access school using the pedestrian routes. Thank you.

Sickness Guidelines

Please remember that, following the advice of Public Health England, we ask that children are kept off school for 48 hours after the last instance of sickness/diarrhoea.

We ask this for two reasons: firstly, it will prevent the spread of the illness throughout the local community and secondly, to allow your child time to fully get back on their feet.

We do understand that children want to return to school and don't want to miss out but it can set them back, particularly if they are not yet eating properly or returned to full health.

We appreciate your help in reducing the spread of these viruses and please remember to contact the school office to notify of absences (not the teachers).

Dates for the Diary

The 'Dates for the Diary' will be sent out in your children's bookbags early next week. It will show the key dates for the coming year to allow you time to arrange time off work for events. The dates may be subject to change, but only in exceptional circumstances and we will give you as much notice as possible.

There will be reminders of the key events in our Weekly Update in the next week at a glance (see above) as well as any changes that may happen.

Remember Packed Lunch Cutlery!

If your child has a packed lunch, please do remember to send any cutlery that they may need eg spoon for yoghurts or fork for salad, the kitchen has limited stocks of cutlery for children taking a school meal.
