## Lockdown Drill

## Uniform

As you know, we are going to be moving to the NEW Parkfield School uniform for new Year 7s starting in September 2022.

The uniform will move to a skirt uniform and a trouser uniform, making them gender neutral. There will be grey trousers and a pleated, patterned skirt. Both uniforms will include the same school



blazer and a tie. From September 2022, students moving into year 9 will also move to the new uniform and financial support will be available through [finance@parkfield.bournemouth.sch.uk](mailto:finance@parkfield.bournemouth.sch.uk) should families need it. The transfer from old to new will take a couple of years to complete but we hope you agree, this is a welcome change. We are working with Stevensons and other providers to ensure that the uniform is affordable in line with the new government guidance. We will have the new uniform available to see at the school on Wednesday 29 June.

## Parent survey results

Thank you to those parents who completed the parent survey back in January. We had just under 120 responses to the questions which have supported us to shape the school as we move towards 2022-23. We were very pleased with the fact that 81% of parents who completed the survey said that they would recommend the school to another parent. And we have indeed seen this over the



past month with the Year 6 into 7 admissions process. We are on track to be full in year 7 for 2022-23 which is excellent news. 71% of responders agreed that their child does well at Parkfield School. However, we understand many parents' frustrations around communication with the school and we are working hard to be more effective at this and I hope you have seen a more positive shift on this front. We continue to strive to do better. If you didn't respond to the survey this year, do look out for it in January 2023.

## School Website

The school website went through a metamorphosis back in August of 2021. With communication being a key stumbling block we have tried to ensure that the website caters for both new and existing parents.

## Performing Arts Roundup

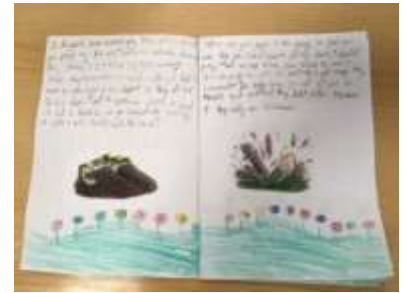

## Whole School reminders

### Parking

The airport has asked us to request that parents and carers don't park on the airport road when they are coming to pick up or drop off their child/children. This is causing the airport road to become congested and as the airport returns to full operation it is becoming a tension between the school and the airport. Thank you for your co-operation with this. We appreciate that there are pinch points in the school day but we do everything we can to alleviate this and limited to only a short period of time.

### Drop Off

For safeguarding reasons, please can we ask that children are not dropped off before 8.20am in the morning. There are times when students are waiting unattended outside the front of the school from before 8am. We appreciate your support with this.

### Living with Covid

The Department of Education update from 1 April stated the following:

- adults with the symptoms of a respiratory infection, and who have a high temperature or feel unwell, should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people until they feel well enough to resume normal activities and they no longer have a high temperature
- children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school, college or childcare when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend
- children and young people aged 18 and under with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days, which is when they are most infectious.
