




INCLUSION update

At Parkfield we offer some different support options for students:

- Pastoral Room – students can use this for some quiet time or to speak to a pastoral officer about anything they're worried about.
- School Counsellor – We have a school counsellor who is in school two days a week and see's students that have been referred to her from the Pastoral Team.
- Community Leaders – Every student on secondary has a community leader who meets with students twice a day. They are students first point of contact and there to support with any issues or concerns they may have.

Please also have a look on our school website under the 'Student' tab which has further advice and resources for parents to access. There are useful contact numbers and websites as well as resources around wellbeing.

At school we have the support of a Safer Schools Officer from Dorset Police who delivers assemblies to our students on a variety of topics and can support with concerns parents or school may have of a police nature.
