



The MPCT Way

At the college, students follow a weekly routine of activities and curriculum. This includes vocational and skills training, physical training, military training days, and assessments.

The MPCT curriculum has been designed to develop our student's physical fitness, essential skills, and self-confidence. The academy operates a 'roll on, roll off' joining process with no set deadline by which to apply, allowing new recruits to join on a weekly basis.

Physical Training

You will be expected to participate in physical training every day at MPCT. This makes up for 50% of the course at MPCT, and will support learner preparation and progression into the military. Being fit and healthy is an essential part of military life and civilian employment. Daily physical training helps you to concentrate and focus during lessons, and you'll become more physically and mentally robust.

Education

Regardless of where you learn, you will conduct daily fitness training, weekly military training and citizenship lessons. You will also take part in monthly careers education sessions, supported by military and civilian recruiters and employers.

Military Training





SERVES 4

Spaghetti Bolognese

Ingredients:

- 1 onion
- 1 clove garlic
- 1 carrot
- 1 celery stick
- 15ml oil
- 250g minced beef
- 400g canned chopped tomatoes
- 15ml tomato puree
- 100ml water
- 1 x 5ml spoon mixed herbs
- Black pepper
- 150g spaghetti



Method

1. Peel and chop the onion. Peel and crush the garlic. Peel and slice the carrot. Finely slice the celery.



2. Fry the onion, garlic, carrot and celery in oil.



3. Add the meat and cook until the mince is lightly browned.



4. Add the tomatoes, tomato puree, mixed herbs and water and mix all the ingredients together. Then add a few twists of black pepper.



5. Bring to the boil, then simmer.



6. While your sauce is simmering, place the spaghetti in a separate saucepan of boiling water.



7. Drain the spaghetti using a colander.



8. Place the spaghetti on a plate, and pour some of the Bolognese over the top.

Keep Calm & Reduce Food Waste



Did you know...

7 million tonnes of food and drink are thrown away across the UK every year!

Together we can help to reduce food waste. All we have to do is change the way we think about leftover food.

Top tips to reduce food waste

- Plan your meals and only buy ingredients you're going to use that week.
- Measure ingredients and use recipes so you only cook what you need.
- Cover and refrigerate any food leftover from dinner and have it for lunch the next day.
- Store food leftovers correctly in the freezer or airtight containers in the fridge.
- Did you know, you can freeze bread close to the best before date and pop it in the toaster to defrost it when you need it!
- Think 'ingredients' not 'leftovers'. Use any leftover food as ingredients to create new delicious and healthy meals.
- Other food can be frozen too peppers and mushrooms are easily stir fried from frozen.

DESIGN YOUR OWN RECIPE CHALLENGE

Today you've been amazing at adapting your recipes.

If you had cooked the original recipes, these are the items you would have had left:

- If you cooked the Thai green curry: 200g coconut milk, half a lime and one chicken breast.
- If you cooked Minestrone soup: 3/4 cabbage, 5 rashers of bacon, garlic, 200g pasta
- If you cooked Spaghetti bolognese: 350g spaghetti, 150g tomato puree, garlic and herbs

Design a recipe that uses these ingredients – you may wish to add other ingredients to make it into a proper meal but remember you should still ensure you include all the food groups. Share it on social media with the hashtag **#bakethemostoflife**



Remember you should check your ingredients are still good to eat: there should be no mould, they should still be within their use by date, and they should have been kept in the correct storage.

Top tips to get you started with your CV

What is a CV?

CV comes from the Latin word curriculum vitae which stands for 'course of life'. It is a short document that summarises your education, skills and experience, which relate to a role you want to apply for.

Do all CVs follow the same format?

No, there are different CV styles, depending on the role and the stage you're at, but there are certain things that employers will always expect you to include (see the checklist).

Who looks at a CV?

It depends on the size of the organisation. It could be just one person, for example, the company owner if it's a small company, or it could start with HR and go to multiple people in a larger company. Many employers now remove personal information that could be used to unfairly advantage or disadvantage you.

How long should a CV be?

The length of a CV depends on your experience and what you need to include, but most employers and recruiters would expect it to be one or two pages at the most.

Where can I get help writing my CV?

If you are at school or college, there should be support available. Speak to your careers adviser and find out. There is also lots more support available online.

What should I include in a CV?

The main sections to include are:

Contact details

Full name, mobile number and email address.

Pronouns

A CV is a good opportunity to share your pronouns if you want to.

Profile / personal statement
A short paragraph, setting out your
main skills and attributes.

Education and qualifications
Including type and grades (if you have not yet taken your exams, you can include predicted grades).

Work or volunteering experience
Details of any paid or unpaid
employment or experiences and a
short summary of tasks completed.

Skills and achievements
For example, software packages
you can use or any languages you
speak and also any soft skills like
communication and teamwork.

Interests and hobbies
This section is useful if you don't have much work experience.

References
You may be asked to provide two
referees that can provide a
personal or professional reference.

Top tips to get you started with your CV

What should I include in my profile / personal statement?

It should be a concise statement (around 100 words) that sums up who you are, what you hope to do and helps you to sound like the right person for the job.

You could include:

- Why you are suitable for, or interested in the role / industry.
- A sentence or two about any work / volunteering experience.
- Any skills, attributes or significant achievements that are relevant.
- Any academic qualifications that are relevant to the role.

How can I make my CV relevant to the role I am applying for?

Look at the job advert and refer to the job description, person specification and company details. Think about how your skills and experience match what the employer is looking for. Make sure you highlight any relevant qualifications, training or experience you have.

Should my CV be the same for everything I apply for?

No, try to tailor some of the sections of your CV so that it is relevant to the role you're applying for. For example, in the interests section, you could say that you enjoy gaming if you're applying for a role in that industry. You should also make sure your profile statement is relevant to the role you're applying for.

TOP TIPS



- Make sure there are no spelling/grammar mistakes.
- Ask someone else to proofread your CV.
- Use active words to highlight your skills and strengths, for example: planned, organised, created.
- Personalise your CV to the employer by linking it with words used in the advert and job description.
- Make sure your email address is professional.
- Include a link to your LinkedIn profile if it's relevant, up-to-date and professional.
- Don't lie or exaggerate.
- Include a covering letter with your CV.

Starting university of South Wales

Starting university is an exciting new chapter

have special educational needs or a disability
(SEND), you might feel uncertain about what to
expect. However, reat assured, UK universities
are dedicated to supporting you every step of
the way. This guide will introduce you to the
resources, adjustments, and services designed
to help you thrive and make the most of your
university experience.

Peclaring your disability

Your first step towards accessing support
is to declare your disability on your UCAS
application or directly to the university.
Many students worry this might affect their
application, but universities are legally
required under the Equality Act 2010 to treat
everyone fairly. Declaring your disability at

helps universities understand your needs and arrange reasonable adjustments to support your learning and university life from the very beginning.

The Disabled Students' Allowance
If you have additional needs due to a disability,
learning difficulty, or long-term health condition,
you can apply for the Disabled Students'
Allowance (DSA) (page 60). This non-repayable
grant can cover the cost of:

- non-medical helpers, such as a mentor or note-taker travel costs related to your disability specialist equipment, like a laptop with assistive software other resources tailored to your needs.

It's important to apply for the Disabled Students' Allowance (DSA) early, as the process can take some time. While it might seem overwhelming at first, universities are here to guide you through it. At the University of South Wales, for instance, you can connect with a Disablity Adviser during open days, taster assisting or through their dedicated email inbor, even before you enrol. These conversations ensure you have the support you need in place, ready for when you start your university journey.

CAREER of the WEEK

Intelligence analyst

Intelligence analysts help keep the country secure by assessing and interpreting intelligence data.

Your role as an intelligence analyst is to protect UK national security and economic wellbeing, as well as to detect and prevent serious organised crime, such as terrorist attacks, cybercrime and drug trafficking.

You'll be involved in the acquisition, evaluation, analysis and assessment of secret intelligence.

Intelligence analysts, also known as intelligence officers, work primarily for the UK's three intelligence and security agencies - Government Communications Headquarters (GCHQ), the Security Service (MI5) and the Secret Intelligence Service (MI6), and also the armed forces and the police. There are also intelligence analyst roles available in other government departments such as HMRC.

Responsibilities

As an intelligence analyst, you'll need to:

- build up intelligence pictures, identifying potential agents and targets. This is done through a range of sources, including signals intelligence (SIGINT) and human intelligence (HUMINT)
- collate and validate intelligence, evaluating the reliability of sources and credibility of information
- use various analytical techniques to assess and interpret intelligence data
- liaise and collaborate with colleagues (such as cryptanalysts, mathematicians and linguists) to gather further information, which may help to piece together the whole picture
- develop relationships with customers to understand their intelligence requirements
- deliver information in formal reports or as presentations and desk-level briefings to customers in government, who include the Ministry of Defence (MOD), the Foreign, Commonwealth & Development Office (FCDO), the Home Office, the National Crime Agency (NCA) and HM Revenue & Customs (HMRC) among others
- develop expertise in a specific area
- observe strict non-disclosure rules about your work, the extent of which will vary depending on your employer

What to expect

- Intelligence analysts work throughout the civil service and are based in every region of the UK. Many jobs are based where the three intelligence and security agencies have their main offices. GCHQ's main site, for example, is based in Cheltenham but it has smaller sites in Cornwall, Manchester and North Yorkshire. The headquarters for MI5 and MI6 are based in central London. MI5 also has regional offices and an office in Northern Ireland. MI6 offers the chance to spend considerable time working overseas.
- New staff usually start work at the agencies' headquarters, although there will be opportunities to work elsewhere in the UK and overseas after several years' experience.
- Intelligence analysts working for the three UK intelligence and security agencies are bound by many of the same rules, terms and working conditions as other government departments. The key difference is the secrecy of the work and the need to protect the identities of staff in order to operate successfully. When applying for a role, you're advised to only tell one close family member or partner. Once you've been accepted, you will get further guidance on who you can tell.
