

The Merchant Navy is a term used to describe commercial shipping. A non-military service, the Merchant Navy is part of a global economy that impacts our daily lives from the food we eat to the things we own and use every day.









An officer trainee is a fully funded three year programme, which leads to both an academic and professional qualification known as a certificate of competency, issued by the Maritime Coastguard Agency.

A cadetship is sponsored by either a shipping company or charitable organisation and will cover all aspects of training, including college fees, travel costs and a monthly bursary payment towards living costs.

All officer trainees are enrolled on approved courses at a UK maritime college, that lead to a professional qualification as well as a nationally recognised educational qualification.

These include:

- Higher National Certificate/Advanced Certificate
- Higher National Diploma/Advanced Diploma
- Foundation Degree (FD) or Scottish Professional Diploma (SPD)
- Bachelors or Honours degree

Entry requirements for Officer Trainee Training are a minimum of 4 GCSEs, grades 4-9 in Maths, English and at least one science-based subject.

The content, duration and timings of each of the programmes will vary according to the particular course, but the core knowledge required for MCA certification requirements for onboard training are the same for all. Cadet training in the UK is broken down into periods, commonly referred to as phases, of which there are five, alternating between college learning and sea time.

The MPCT Way

At the college, students follow a weekly routine of activities and curriculum. This includes vocational and skills training, physical training, military training days, and assessments.

The MPCT curriculum has been designed to develop our student's physical fitness, essential skills, and self-confidence. The academy operates a 'roll on, roll off' joining process with no set deadline by which to apply, allowing new recruits to join on a weekly basis.

Physical Training

You will be expected to participate in physical training every day at MPCT. This makes up for 50% of the course at MPCT, and will support learner preparation and progression into the military. Being fit and healthy is an essential part of military life and civilian employment. Daily physical training helps you to concentrate and focus during lessons, and you'll become more physically and mentally robust.

Education

Regardless of where you learn, you will conduct daily fitness training, weekly military training and citizenship lessons. You will also take part in monthly careers education sessions, supported by military and civilian recruiters and employers.

Military Training

Our courses are designed to give learners the skills needed to start their journey towards a rewarding career in the British Armed Forces or to progress on to further education or training. Problem-solving and leadership skills are essential in the Armed Forces and civilian employment. Learners will take part in a range of problem-solving activities both in the field and in academic lessons. The ability to work effectively as a team member will be essential to your success.



Keep Calm and Cook Recipes



SERVES 2

Minestrone Soup

Ingredients:

- 1 clove of garlic
- ¼ cabbage
- 1 onion
- 1 rasher of bacon
- 1 carrot
- 1 stick of celery
- 1 potato
- 1 stock cube and 800ml boiling water
- 1 x 5ml spoon mixed herbs
- Black pepper

Method

Peel and crush the garlic.
 Shred the cabbage.
 Chop the onion.
 Chop the bacon.



2. Fry the onion, garlic and bacon in the oil.



3. Stir in the potato, celery and carrot.



4. Add the boiling water to the pan and the stock cube.



5. Stir in the finely shredded cabbage and sliced tomato.



6. Add the mixed herbs and black pepper, bring to the boil and simmer.



7. Add the pasta and simmer.





8. Serve in a bowl.

Keep Calm & Reduce Food Waste



Did you know...

7 million tonnes of food and drink are thrown away across the UK every year!

Together we can help to reduce food waste. All we have to do is change the way we think about leftover food.

Top tips to reduce food waste

- Plan your meals and only buy ingredients you're going to use that week.
- Measure ingredients and use recipes so you only cook what you need.
- Cover and refrigerate any food leftover from dinner and have it for lunch the next day.
- Store food leftovers correctly in the freezer or airtight containers in the fridge.
- Did you know, you can freeze bread close to the best before date and pop it in the toaster to defrost it when you need it!
- Think 'ingredients' not 'leftovers'. Use any leftover food as ingredients to create new delicious and healthy meals.
- Other food can be frozen too peppers and mushrooms are easily stir fried from frozen.

DESIGN YOUR OWN RECIPE CHALLENGE

Today you've been amazing at adapting your recipes.

If you had cooked the original recipes, these are the items you would have had left:

- If you cooked the Thai green curry: 200g coconut milk, half a lime and one chicken breast.
- If you cooked Minestrone soup: 3/4 cabbage, 5 rashers of bacon, garlic, 200g pasta
- If you cooked Spaghetti bolognese: 350g spaghetti, 150g tomato puree, garlic and herbs

Design a recipe that uses these ingredients – you may wish to add other ingredients to make it into a proper meal but remember you should still ensure you include all the food groups. Share it on social media with the hashtag **#bakethemostoflife**



Remember you should check your ingredients are still good to eat: there should be no mould, they should still be within their use by date, and they should have been kept in the correct storage.



GET READY TO APPLY FOR APPRENTICESHIPS



1. Understand the recruitment process

The recruitment process will vary from employer to employer. It is important to understand what could be involved by doing some research, so that you are aware of what to expect at each stage. Tick the boxes when you feel confident that you understand what each of these stages could involve, and that you know what you would need to do to get ready.



2. Prepare in advance

Get these things as ready as possible before vacancies start appearing:

CV (even though some employers may not require a CV, collating your achievements and skills in a succinct way is a useful process when preparing to apply)
 Covering letter
 List of qualifications and folder of any certificates
 List of your skills and examples of when you've used them
 Make sure your email address and voicemail message are sensible and professional
 Set up a LinkedIn profile and start liking and sharing things that are relevant to the sector you want to work in
 Google yourself - check what appears when you search for yourself on the internet. Ensure that accounts are set to private, and that any information that does appear is professional and appropriate



3. Research what employers want

Look online and at previous adverts to see the desired and essential attributes, skills and qualifications. See if you can find out what former applicants say and talk to careers staff to see if they can advise and support you. If they are looking for something you don't have yet - you'll have time to think of some ways that you might be able to gain some experience.

4. Research recruitment processes

Do your research and find out what recruitment processes are like for the employers you're interested in and try to get ahead of what to expect. Many employers will use their websites to explain the different types of activities that they use, and they may also provide examples of practice questions/tests. Some employers will provide indicative timelines for the recruitment process so that you can understand how long the process may take.

5. Reasonable adjustments

Whilst you are researching the different recruitment processes, you may find information from the employer explaining the different types of support that they can offer candidates with additional needs. Some employers will provide a lot of information, whilst others may offer that you can notify them of any requirements that you have, and that these will be considered. Many employers will need you to help them understand the adjustments that you may require, so getting this prepared in advance of applying can be beneficial.

Talk to the staff at your school/college to help you to think of the types of adjustments that could be most beneficial for you. For example, if you currently receive extra time within exams, you may to ask the employer if they could allow you extra time in any assessment activities. Or if there is assistive technology that you like to use, you could ask the employer to make this available.

6. Careers support

Your school/college careers team will be pleased to help you in preparing to apply for apprenticeships. Make sure you engage with your school/college and any local careers support:

Talk to the careers staff at your school /college and make sure they know	what vou	re looking for

- Sign up for (and read) careers newsletters from your school/college, employers, local careers hubs...
- Follow the social media accounts of your school/college careers team, employer recruitment teams and any other local careers organisations
- Make sure your subject teachers know what you're looking for, especially if it's a sector linked to their subject area

7. Get registered

Sign up for Find an apprenticeship (the Government apprenticeship vacancies website), and Vacancy Snapshot (a monthly apprenticeship vacancies email), even if you aren't ready to start applying yet - looking at adverts is great advance research.

8. Be ready to track

Once you start applying, it is really helpful to have a way to track where you are at in the application process with each employer. How you do this is up to you but you should try to:

Include what you have to do and when by
Include any key information like website links and email addresses
Put alerts in your phone or calendar for all key deadlines
Save copies of any applications that you make so that you can refer back to them if you are shortlisted to the next stage

9. Think about references

Some employers will ask you to submit the contact details of up to two referees. These are usually people that know you in a more formal relationship - such as your form tutor, head of year or your supervisor from a part-time job (if you have one). Occasionally, employers may also ask you for someone who could provide a character reference. This could include a less formal relationship, such as a family member, or someone who knows you well such as a coach from a sports team.

It can be useful to think about who you would approach to provide you with a reference should you need one, and to gain their permission in advance.

How Lando Norris Found Purpose Long Before F1 Fame

Before Lando Norris was racing at 200 miles an hour, he was in the McLaren garage with his sleeves rolled up, dismantling cars and packing boxes alongside the mechanics.

No glamour, no podiums, no champagne, just long, unseen hours helping the team.

What struck me most is that he didn't do it because he had to. He wasn't playing politics, and he didn't know he'd one day end up in the driver's seat. He did it because he wanted to contribute, to learn, and to build trust with the people who would one day hold his life in their hands.

Psychologist Dr. Amy Wrzesniewski found that people usually see work in three ways: as a job, a career, or a calling. A job gets you a paycheck and a career gives you progress. But a calling? That's where you show up because the work itself matters, to you and often to others.

That's the difference between seeing work as a job and seeing it as a calling.

Lando's time in the garage looked like grunt work from the outside. But in his mind, it was something deeper.

He wasn't just lifting equipment, he was building belonging, and he wasn't just tightening bolts, he was creating the foundation for trust that would carry him when the pressure was highest.

And those unseen hours created bonds that later helped him thrive under the pressure of race day.

The truth is, you don't need to be a Formula One driver to apply the same habit. Dr. Wrzesniewski calls it job crafting: reframing the task in front of you so it carries greater meaning. A hospital cleaner can say, "I mop floors," or they can say, "I help patients recover in a safe environment." A teacher can say, "I mark papers," or they can say, "I help young people believe in themselves."

The tasks may be the same, but the story changes everything.

LISTEN TO THE EPISODE

So here's my challenge for you this week: Pick one task you usually see as small or thankless, and reframe it. Instead of "sending emails," maybe it's "creating clarity and connection." Instead of "filling out spreadsheets," maybe it's "making sure decisions are based on truth, not guesswork." The task doesn't change, but your sense of purpose does.

High performance isn't only about the spotlight moments. It's about the meaning we create in the quiet, hidden ones.

APPRENTICESHIP LEVELS EXPLAINED



Ranging from foundation to degree level

What are the different levels of apprenticeship?

Apprenticeship levels range from level 2 (foundation and intermediate) through to level 7 (master's level) covering a wide range of different job roles across all sectors.

Which level is right for you?

The level of apprenticeship undertaken will depend on the needs of the employer and the job role, as well as the apprentice, their previous experience and qualifications held. Your training provider will also be able to guide you as to the most appropriate level for you.

L2	Foundation
L2	Intermediate
L3	Advanced
L4+	Higher
L6-7	Degree

How long do apprenticeships at different levels take?

The apprenticeship standard will set out the expected duration of the apprenticeship, with a new minimum duration of 8 months being introduced from 1st August 2025 for some apprenticeships. The planned duration will be agreed with the employer, apprentice and training provider.

Foundation apprenticeships

Introduced from August 2025, foundation apprenticeships will support individuals who are:

- aged between 16 and 21 (or 15 years of age if the apprentice's 16th birthday is between the last Friday of June and 31st August)
- aged between 22 and 24 years old, who either
 - hold an Education, Health and Care (EHC) plan
 - have been, or are, in the care of their local authority
 - o are in prison or a prison leaver

Foundation apprenticeships are designed to have a minimum duration of 8 months, and to support progression onto a further level of apprenticeship.

Intermediate apprenticeships

Intermediate apprenticeships are typically considered to be the same level as GCSEs. They are a fantastic way to get started with your career in an entry level role within an organisation.

APPRENTICESHIP LEVELS EXPLAINED



Ranging from foundation to degree level

Advanced apprenticeships

Advanced apprenticeships are considered to be the same level as A-levels, T Levels or other level 3 qualifications. Many individuals who have completed a level 3 qualification will progress to an advanced apprenticeship to gain workplace experience and knowledge.

Higher apprenticeships

Higher apprenticeships include qualifications at levels 4 and above. They can be suitable for those looking to progress from level 3 qualifications, including advanced apprenticeships and T Levels.

Degree apprenticeships

Degree apprenticeships are offered by universities and other Higher Education providers. They contain either a full degree, or a degree-level qualification and go up to master's level (which is post-graduate).

Can you do more than one apprenticeship?

Yes! The great thing about apprenticeships is that you can complete more than one during your career. The level and type of apprenticeship that you undertake will depend on your prior learning and the job role that you are doing. Speak to your employer and training provider to find out which options could be available for you in the future.



What is changing?

As well as the introduction of foundation apprenticeships from August 2025 (see page 1 of this Rapid Read), the government has announced that from 1st January 2026, level 7 apprenticeships will continue to be governmentfunded for young people aged 16-21, and aged 22-24 for care leavers and those with an Education, Health and Care (EHC) plan at the start of their apprenticeship in England. You can read more about the changes to level 7 apprenticeships through the Government website (see link below).

(SEND), you might feel uncertain about what to
expect. However, reat assured, UK universities

resources, adjustments, and services designed

Peclaring your disability

Your first step towards accessing support
is to declare your disability on your UCAS
application or directly to the university.
Many students worry this might affect their
application, but universities are legally
required under the Equality Act 2010 to treat
everyone fairly. Declaring your disability at

helps universities understand your needs and arrange reasonable adjustments to support your learning and university life from the very beginning.

The Disabled Students' Allowance
If you have additional needs due to a disability,
learning difficulty, or long-term health condition,
you can apply for the Disabled Students'
Allowance (DSA) (page 60). This non-repayable
grant can cover the cost of:

- non-medical helpers, such as a mentor or note-taker travel costs related to your disability specialist equipment, like a laptop with assistive software other resources tailored to your needs.

It's important to apply for the Disabled Students' Allowance (DSA) early, as the process can take some time. While it might seem overwhelming at first, universities are here to guide you through it. At the University of South Wales, for instance, you can connect with a Disablity Adviser during open days, taster assisting or through their dedicated email inbor, even before you enrol. These conversations ensure you have the support you need in place, ready for when you start your university journey.

Actor

Actors communicate a character or situation to an audience through speech, body language and movement across a variety of mediums, including theatre, film, television, radio and video.

Working as an actor usually involves interpreting the work of a writer under the instruction and support of a director, although you may be required to devise a character or improvise the reactions of a character to a situation.

Work varies enormously, from live stage performances of the classics and community theatre to soap operas, radio work, television advertising and film parts. As well as providing entertainment, an actor's role may also involve education, training or therapy.

Responsibilities

As an actor, you'll need to:

- seek out work and network
- liaise with an agent
- prepare for and attend auditions
- learn lines and rehearse
- research or undertake activities to help prepare for a part and to enable you to 'get into character'
- discuss interpretation and delivery with other members of the company and the director
- perform for a live audience
- perform in a studio or on location for film, television, internet and radio broadcast
- do voice-overs for advertisements or record audiobooks
- manage the performance area, costumes and props
- undertake activities associated with touring, such as driving a van, and 'get-ins' and 'get-outs' at theatres (i.e. setting up and dismantling the performance area)
- liaise with venue managers and accommodation providers
- keep records for company managers
- work as a walk-on or extra for television or film

What to expect

Unless you work on the same set, such as a particular television studio, it's likely your place of work will change frequently. For example, you may work in different theatres or studios, work outside in street theatre, or on location in a range of indoor and outdoor settings.

Actors are usually self-employed for tax purposes and not all employers pay National Insurance contributions. For this reason, accurate record-keeping skills are essential, and many actors employ an accountant.

The lifestyle implications are considerable. Time spent away from home is an inevitable part of the job. Disruption to home and social life may be unavoidable. Many actors leave the profession because of difficulties finding work.

You may find yourself working all over the UK and abroad. Auditions are usually held in London or other major cities, and you may be required to attend them at very short notice.

Word-of-mouth recommendations and networking connections are very common in this industry, so it's essential to demonstrate professionalism in your work. This includes being punctual, polite and well-prepared.
