

For those who are intending to take up an apprenticeship position, or a place in the armed services - you must have a full-time college course in place as a back up option. You do not want to be stuck at home when everyone else is at college because you didn't apply.

You can apply to as many colleges as you want - have your interviews and accept all your places. You only decide which one you are enrolling at on the day you receive your GCSE results in August 2026.



WHAT ARE T LEVELS?



Post-16 technical education

What are T Levels?

T Levels are qualifications combining classroom learning, alongside an industry placement. They are designed for young people as an option following GCSEs (post-16) and are taught in schools and colleges.

KEY FACTS



- They last for 2 years.
- They are equivalent to three A-levels.
- They attract UCAS points.
- They have been created alongside employers.
- They include an 'industry placement' of at least 45 days.
- For anyone not quite ready, there is a pre-T Level foundation year.
- Students will receive a nationally recognised qualification.

How is a T Level structured?

80% of the qualification is classroom-based and 20% is spent undertaking an industry placement with an employer in the workplace. Your training provider will be responsible for finding the employer(s) that will provide your 45-day industry placement.

There are currently 21 T Level subjects available.




How can I find out which providers offer T Levels?


The government has created a really useful website where you can enter your postcode and search for T Level providers that are local to you.

Here's what you can do:










What is the difference between T Levels and apprenticeships?

Apprenticeships are real, paid jobs, suitable for students who know which job role they want to pursue. T Levels are largely classroom-based (80%) and contain a substantive industry placement (approximately 20%).





How are T Levels graded?

Students who complete their T Level receive a nationally recognised certificate which shows their overall grade and a breakdown of what they have achieved. Students who meet all of the requirements of their T Level are awarded an overall grade of either Pass, Merit, Distinction or Distinction*. Students who do not pass all elements of their T Level receive a T Level statement of achievement, which will show the elements they have completed.

What is the T Level Foundation Year?

The T Level Foundation Year is a one-year, level 2 study programme intended for students who have the 'potential to progress' onto a T Level programme. This is a great option for someone who would benefit from additional study time and preparation before doing a T Level. It provides relevant knowledge, practical and study skills along with English, maths and digital skills. Check with the T Level provider if they offer this.



Starting university is an exciting new chapter
filled with opportunities and challenges. If you
have special educational needs or a disability
(SEND), you might feel uncertain about what to
expect. However, reat assured, UK universities
are dedicated to supporting you every step of
the way. This guide will introduce you to the
resources, adjustments, and services designed
to help you thrive and make the most of your
university experience.

Peclaring your disability

Your first step towards accessing support
is to declare your disability on your UCAS
application or directly to the university.
Many students worry this might affect their
application, but universities are legally
required under the Equality Act 2010 to treat
everyone fairly. Declaring your disability at

helps universities understand your needs and arrange reasonable adjustments to support your learning and university life from the very beginning.

The Disabled Students' Allowance
If you have additional needs due to a disability,
learning difficulty, or long-term health condition,
you can apply for the Disabled Students'
Allowance (DSA) (page 60). This non-repayable
grant can cover the cost of:

- non-medical helpers, such as a mentor or note-taker travel costs related to your disability specialist equipment, like a laptop with assistive software other resources tailored to your needs.

It's important to apply for the Disabled Students' Allowance (DSA) early, as the process can take some time. While it might seem overwhelming at first, universities are here to guide you through it. At the University of South Wales, for instance, you can connect with a Disablity Adviser during open days, taster assisting or through their dedicated email inbor, even before you enrol. These conversations ensure you have the support you need in place, ready for when you start your university journey.

What happens at the end of an apprenticeship?

What is End Point Assessment?

End Point Assessment (also commonly referred to as EPA) is the final stage of the apprenticeship programme. The purpose of EPA is to confirm that the apprentice has met all of the knowledge, skills and behaviour requirements set out in the apprenticeship standard.

What is an apprenticeship standard?

Each apprenticeship has a standard which sets out the main purpose of the apprenticeship, the job roles linked to the standard and the expected knowledge, skills and behaviours that the apprentice should have achieved. There are approximately 700 different apprenticeship standards available. You can view the current and planned apprenticeship standards on the Skills England website(see link below).






How does EPA work?

To reach EPA, the apprentice will have completed a series of activities and tasks with their employer and training provider. They will then jointly agree that the apprentice is ready to move forward for their End Point Assessment. This stage is called 'the gateway'.

End Point Assessment methods

This short film (4 minutes) explains the different types of assessment methods (see link below).







What are the EPA requirements?

The process of EPA is different for each apprenticeship standard. It could include a range of different activities such as:

- Presentation of a portfolio
- Professional discussion
- Test
- Practical demonstration

The whole process of EPA is co-ordinated and conducted by a third-party organisation that is not connected to the employer or training provider. This organisation is called the End Point Assessment Organisation (EPAO).

Additional support

If you require additional support to complete your EPA, your training provider will be able to make appropriate arrangements for you. These could include:

- Extra time allowance
- A scribe
- A reader
- A personal support worker to attend
- British Sign Language (BSL) interpreter
- Assistive technology

Who regulates EPAs?

EPAs are regulated by Ofqual, the Office of Qualifications and Examinations Regulation. Ofqual also regulates other qualifications, for example, GCSEs, A-levels and Functional Skills. It protects the interests of apprentices and students taking qualifications and assessments. Find out more about Ofqual's role in EPA (see link below).

What happens if you don't pass?

If you have not passed any elements of your EPA, then you will usually be able to re-take the parts that you need. This can sometimes limit the overall grade that you can achieve.


What happens on completion of EPA?

When you have successfully completed your EPA, you will have achieved your full apprenticeship. You will receive a grade of either pass / merit / distinction (this varies between different apprenticeships). You will then receive your apprenticeship certificate, issued to you by the Department for Education.



What is changing?

The Government is reviewing the way that apprenticeship End Point Assessment is conducted, making it more streamlined and simplified. From April 2025 all apprenticeship standards and associated assessment plans will be reviewed and updated. This is expected to take up to 18 months to complete. Get busy in the kitchen!




Cut the soft lard into pieces and put it in a bowl with the bird seed.

Choreographer

You'll create dance routines for live shows, on stage, events, TV, films, music videos, fashion shows, corporate events and even on ice.

This usually involves planning the whole performance, from teaching the steps to the dancers to working with costume designers and directors to achieve the desired outcome. You might create your own dance pieces or interpret a director's instructions depending on the brief provided.

You'll need a high level of dancing ability, the patience to teach others and to know what looks good to a wider audience, as well as the communication skills needed to make sure that your directions are coming across clearly to your dancers.

The most successful choreographers run whole shows by themselves, playing out storylines and themes through meticulous planning of dances, costumes, music and visuals, to engage the audience. Choreographers often run their own dance schools, which also involves balancing their own accounts and managing costs.

Types of choreography

Choreographers usually specialise in one style of dance, such as:

- classical ballet
- contemporary dance forms such as jazz, hip-hop, street or freestyle
- musical theatre
- ballroom and Latin American, such as salsa
- highland or Scottish country (ceilidh) dancing
- cultural, such as Irish, Indian, African or belly dancing
- ice dancing
- disability dance

Responsibilities

Depending on your area of specialism, you'll need to:

- develop ideas and create and develop routines to produce a well-polished performance
- plan movements to fit to music, guided by artistic and musical directors
- discuss ideas and plans with producers, costume designers, and musical and artistic directors
- choose music suitable for the concept or subject you have been tasked with
- audition, teach and rehearse dancers
- for some forms of dance, you may be required to record the steps using a notation system, such as Labanotation or Benesh
- work with other professionals to choreograph fight scenes or theatrical stunts
- be able to work on more than one show at a time
- meet regularly with producers, musical and artistic directors, and costume designers

If you're freelance, you'll also need to promote and market yourself, find new work and deal with your own tax and accounts.

What to expect

- You're likely to be working on more than one production at a time.
- You may mainly work in dance studios and rehearsal rooms, but also in theatres, film and TV studios, nightclubs, halls and holiday centres.
- There may be a lot of travel, possibly including overseas. There will likely be more travel involved the higher up the chain you get, as popular shows often tour a country or even a continent.
- You must keep up your fitness levels and stamina throughout your career.
- You might have to spend long periods away from home.
