
Welcome back to another packed edition of Career News. In this week's issue:

Starting university of South Wales

Starting university is an exciting new chapter
filled with opportunities and challenges. If you
have special educational needs or a disability
(SEND), you might feel uncertain about what to
expect. However, reat assured, UK universities
are dedicated to supporting you every step of
the way. This guide will introduce you to the
resources, adjustments, and services designed
to help you thrive and make the most of your
university experience.

Peclaring your disability

Your first step towards accessing support
is to declare your disability on your UCAS
application or directly to the university.
Many students worry this might affect their
application, but universities are legally
required under the Equality Act 2010 to treat
everyone fairly. Declaring your disability at

helps universities understand your needs and arrange reasonable adjustments to support your learning and university life from the very beginning.

The Disabled Students' Allowance
If you have additional needs due to a disability,
learning difficulty, or long-term health condition,
you can apply for the Disabled Students'
Allowance (DSA) (page 60). This non-repayable
grant can cover the cost of:

- non-medical helpers, such as a mentor or note-taker travel costs related to your disability specialist equipment, like a laptop with assistive software other resources tailored to your needs.

It's important to apply for the Disabled Students' Allowance (DSA) early, as the process can take some time. While it might seem overwhelming at first, universities are here to guide you through it. At the University of South Wales, for instance, you can connect with a Disablity Adviser during open days, taster assisting or through their dedicated email inbor, even before you enrol. These conversations ensure you have the support you need in place, ready for when you start your university journey.

# END POINT ASSESSMENT EXPLAINED



What happens at the end of an apprenticeship?

### What is End Point Assessment?

End Point Assessment (also commonly referred to as EPA) is the final stage of the apprenticeship programme. The purpose of EPA is to confirm that the apprentice has met all of the knowledge, skills and behaviour requirements set out in the apprenticeship standard.

### What is an apprenticeship standard?

Each apprenticeship has a standard which sets out the main purpose of the apprenticeship, the job roles linked to the standard and the expected knowledge, skills and behaviours that the apprentice should have achieved. There are approximately 700 different apprenticeship standards available. You can view the current and planned apprenticeship standards on the Skills England website(see link below).






### How does EPA work?

To reach EPA, the apprentice will have completed a series of activities and tasks with their employer and training provider. They will then jointly agree that the apprentice is ready to move forward for their End Point Assessment. This stage is called 'the gateway'.

### **End Point Assessment methods**

This short film (4 minutes) explains the different types of assessment methods (see link below).







### What are the EPA requirements?

The process of EPA is different for each apprenticeship standard. It could include a range of different activities such as:

- Presentation of a portfolio
- Professional discussion
- Test
- Practical demonstration

The whole process of EPA is co-ordinated and conducted by a third-party organisation that is not connected to the employer or training provider. This organisation is called the End Point Assessment Organisation (EPAO).

### **Additional support**

If you require additional support to complete your EPA, your training provider will be able to make appropriate arrangements for you. These could include:

- Extra time allowance
- A scribe
- A reader
- A personal support worker to attend
- British Sign Language (BSL) interpreter
- Assistive technology

### Who regulates EPAs?

EPAs are regulated by Ofqual, the Office of Qualifications and Examinations Regulation. Ofqual also regulates other qualifications, for example, GCSEs, A-levels and Functional Skills. It protects the interests of apprentices and students taking qualifications and assessments. Find out more about Ofqual's role in EPA (see link below).

### What happens if you don't pass?

If you have not passed any elements of your EPA, then you will usually be able to re-take the parts that you need. This can sometimes limit the overall grade that you can achieve.


### What happens on completion of EPA?

When you have successfully completed your EPA, you will have achieved your full apprenticeship. You will receive a grade of either pass / merit / distinction (this varies between different apprenticeships). You will then receive your apprenticeship certificate, issued to you by the Department for Education.



### What is changing?

The Government is reviewing the way that apprenticeship End Point Assessment is conducted, making it more streamlined and simplified. From April 2025 all apprenticeship standards and associated assessment plans will be reviewed and updated. This is expected to take up to 18 months to complete. # FOUNDATION APPRENTICESHIPS



### Explore this exciting new apprenticeship programme

### What are foundation apprenticeships?

Foundation apprenticeships help young people gain technical knowledge and skills while earning a wage. They are designed for young people typically aged 16 to 21 (or 22-24 meeting the eligibility criteria) who want hands-on experience in key sectors like construction, digital and social care. These level 2 apprenticeships combine technical knowledge and skills with workplace learning, helping the apprentice to decide their next career steps.

### Which standards are available?

The <u>first foundation apprenticeships</u> focus on industrial strategy and government mission areas, including:

### **Engineering & manufacturing**

- Building service engineering
- Engineering and manufacturing

### Construction

- Finishing trades
- Onsite trades

### Digital

- Hardware, network and infrastructure
- Software and data

### Health

• Health and social care

### Where can you find vacancies?

As foundation apprenticeships are a new programme from 1<sup>st</sup> August 2025, it may take some time before we start to see lots of vacancies become available. Vacancies will start to appear on the Government's <u>Find an Apprenticeship website</u>, as well as other jobs sites, employer websites and social media.

### Who can be a foundation apprentice?

Foundation apprenticeships are only available for young people who are:

- aged between 16 and 21 (or 15 years of age if the apprentice's 16th birthday is between the last Friday of June and 31st August)
- aged between 22 and 24 years old, who either
  - hold an Education, Health and Care plan
  - have been, or are, in the care of their local authority
  - are in prison or a prison leaver

### **KEY FACTS**



### Foundation apprenticeships

- typically last for 8 months.
- support progression to more specialised apprenticeships (level 2 or 3) or direct entry to employment.
- help apprentices to develop employability skills and behaviours common to the workplace.
- are paid positions where the apprentice must be paid at least the National Minimum Wage for Apprentices.
- are currently available in 4 sectors, covering 7 different job roles.
- are for young people aged 16-21 (or 22-24 meeting eligibility criteria).
- have their own apprenticeship standard and assessment plan.

# CAREER of the WEEK

### Town Planner

Town planners plan and design buildings, parks and roads to make places attractive, sustainable and convenient for people to use.

As a town planner or planning officer, you'll be involved in the management and development of cities, towns, villages and the countryside. Your aim will be to balance the conflicting demands of housing, industrial development, agriculture, recreation, transport and the environment, in order to allow appropriate development to take place. It is a highly interdisciplinary profession that allows you to interact with many different sectors and people.

Regeneration within towns and cities forms an important part of planning and part of your role will be to take into account the often competing views of local businesses and communities.

If you work within a rural area, you'll need to ensure that development is sustainable and that the right balance of development is achieved to preserve the countryside. You'll also aim to make a positive contribution towards tackling the effects of climate change.

### Responsibilities

As a planner, you'll need to:

- cover a broad area of work using many different skills
- choose whether to specialise in a particular area, such as protecting the historical environment or urban design, or to work across a variety of areas
- develop creative and original planning solutions to satisfy all parties
- consult with stakeholders and other interested parties
- negotiate with developers and other professionals, such as surveyors and architects
- research and design planning policies to guide development and provide essential advice
- assess planning applications and monitor outcomes as necessary, while checking that laws and regulations are adhered to
- research and analyse data to help inform strategic developments, such as increases in affordable housing provision
- · design layouts and draft design statements
- use information technology systems such as computer-aided design (CAD) or geographical information systems (GIS)
- attend and present at planning boards, appeals and public inquiries, providing insights and suggesting improvements where required
- keep up to date with legislation associated with land use
- promote environmental education and awareness
- help disadvantaged groups express their opinions about planning issues and proposals, and visit sites to assess the effects of proposals on people or the environment
- coordinate available resources to meet planning targets
- write reports, often of a complex nature, which make recommendations or explain detailed regulations. These reports may be for a range of groups, from borough councils to regional assemblies, or members of the public
