



ADVANCED NATIONAL (SINGLE A-LEVEL EQUIVALENT)

This qualification will give you a thorough understanding of cyber security threats and how networks operate, preparing you to progress to further study. The Disabled Students' Allowance
If you have additional needs due to a disability,
learning difficulty, or long-term health condition,
you can apply for the Disabled Students'
Allowance (DSA) (page 60). This non-repayable
grant can cover the cost of:

- non-medical helpers, such as a mentor or note-taker travel costs related to your disability specialist equipment, like a laptop with assistive software other resources tailored to your needs.

It's important to apply for the Disabled Students' Allowance (DSA) early, as the process can take some time. While it might seem overwhelming at first, universities are here to guide you through it. At the University of South Wales, for instance, you can connect with a Disablity Adviser during open days, taster assisting or through their dedicated email inbor, even before you enrol. These conversations ensure you have the support you need in place, ready for when you start your university journey.



What are foundation apprenticeships?

Foundation apprenticeships help young people gain technical knowledge and skills while earning a wage. They are designed for young people typically aged 16 to 21 (or 22-24 meeting the eligibility criteria) who want hands-on experience in key sectors like construction, digital and social care. These level 2 apprenticeships combine technical knowledge and skills with workplace learning, helping the apprentice to decide their next career steps.

Which standards are available?

The <u>first foundation apprenticeships</u> focus on industrial strategy and government mission areas, including:

- Engineering and manufacturing

Where can you find vacancies?

As foundation apprenticeships are a new programme from 1st August 2025, it may take some time before we start to see lots of vacancies become available. Vacancies will start to appear on the Government's <u>Find an Apprenticeship website</u>, as well as other jobs sites, employer websites and social media.

Who can be a foundation apprentice?

Foundation apprenticeships are only available for young people who are:

- aged between 16 and 21 (or 15 years of age if the apprentice's 16th birthday is between the last Friday of June and 31st August)
- aged between 22 and 24 years old, who either
 - hold an Education, Health and Care plan
 - have been, or are, in the care of their local authority
 - are in prison or a prison leaver

KEY FACTS



Foundation apprenticeships

- typically last for 8 months.
- support progression to more specialised apprenticeships (level 2 or 3) or direct entry to employment.
- help apprentices to develop employability skills and behaviours common to the workplace.
- are paid positions where the apprentice must be paid at least the National Minimum Wage for Apprentices.
- are currently available in 4 sectors, covering 7 different job roles.
- are for young people aged 16-21 (or 22-24 meeting eligibility criteria).
- have their own apprenticeship standard and assessment plan.

- Dietetics
- Radiography
- Prosthetics and Orthotics
- Speech and Language Therapy
- Pharmacy

The sooner students begin work experience, the better. During the work experience day, students will follow 2 patients from their initial presentation to recovery. They will gain a unique insight into how patients interact with a variety of healthcare professionals and what it's like to work in an NHS multidisciplinary team.

Attendees will have the opportunity to interact with healthcare professionals throughout each day. This will empower students to make an informed career decision and demonstrate their commitment to healthcare in their UCAS applications.

Students will receive certificates as evidence of having participated in the work experience programme. Those that complete the full 5-month programme will also be awarded Highly Commended References.

Dispensing Optician

Dispensing opticians dispense and fit spectacles and other optical aids, working from prescriptions written by optometrists and ophthalmologists, and offer advice and guidance to patients around matters relating to eye health.

You'll advise patients on various types of spectacle lenses, including different designs and materials to suit the individual patient's visual requirements. This tailored advice will also cover spectacle frames, including style, fit, weight and colour. You'll also advise on how they should wear and care for their spectacles and, with further training as a contact lens optician, prescribe contact lenses and undertake follow-up appointments.

You will often be the first point of contact for patients, who can range from children to the elderly.

To work as a dispensing optician in the UK, you must be registered with the General Optical Council (GOC).

Responsibilities

As a dispensing optician, you'll need to:

- interpret optical prescriptions written by optometrists or ophthalmologists
- give advice to patients on lens type, coatings and tints, frames and styling, and adjust, fit and repair spectacles
- with further training, fit contact lenses, give advice on their care and use, and conduct aftercare follow-up appointments
- take frame and facial measurements to ensure correct frame fit and positioning
- offer appropriate advice and guidance to patients visiting the practice on a range of common eye conditions, such as dry eye, referring them to other eyecare professionals when appropriate
- advise on and dispense low vision aids, such as magnifiers, for partially-sighted patients
- advise patients when adjustments or repairs to spectacles are needed
- select, manage and order a range of optical products
- order lenses from prescription laboratories
- check lenses on delivery to ensure that they meet the required specifications
- arrange and maintain displays
- liaise with sales representatives from product suppliers
- supervise and train student dispensing opticians

If you're a practice manager, you'll also need to:

- recruit staff and manage their training and professional development
- undertake the day-to-day management of the practice, ensuring that everything runs effectively and smoothly
- take responsibility for setting and meeting sales targets and helping the practice grow
- maintain stock levels
- plan and administer business development, including marketing activities and business plans
- keep accurate patient and business records
