



CV stands for curriculum vitae. That's Latin for your 'course of life' and that's basically what the document does. It tells people who you are and what you've done up to the point of applying.

What should your CV include?

- Name
- Contact details
- Personal profile
- Key skills
- Education
- Work experience
- References
- Hobbies and interests/achievements

You DO NOT need to include your age, date of birth or nationality. Employers shouldn't consider those things when deciding to offer you an interview. You also don't need to include a photo.

What should your CV look like?

There's no need to try and stand out with jazzy fonts and fluorescent paper. Your CV should be clear and easy to read.

Your CV should:

- Be no longer than two pages.
- Use an easy-to-read font like Arial or Times New Roman. The font should be black and sized between 10-12.
- Use headings and bullet points. Keep the layout simple and make it easy to read.
- Use plain language.







Employers look for candidates who show a genuine interest in their company. A great way to stand out is by finding a personal connection to their values, projects or initiatives. During my applications, I made sure to highlight what resonated with me from the research I did about each company.

Tip 2 - Giving examples

Employers don't just want to hear that you're a 'hard worker' or a 'great team player', they want proof. Did you lead a group project? Organise an event? Plan a multi-destination budget holiday wi 5+ people? Show, don't just tell.

Tip 3 - Assessment centres

Assessment centres Assessment centres, employers aren't looking for the loudest person in the room. They want to see collaboration, problem-solving, adaptability and how well you work with others. Instead of treating it like a competition, focus on being a strong team player. Stay engaged, contribute thoughtfully, and listen as much as you speak.

Tip 4 - Rejection

Not every application will be a success, and that's okay. If you don't make it through, ask for feedback Many companies are happy to provide insights that can help improve for the next time. The key is to keep going.

Training 2000 Interview tips...

Top tips for a successful interview

Plan your journey

Allow extra time and plan to arrive at least 15 minutes early. If you are unfamiliar with the location, do a test run.

Research, research and research!

Be prepared for the interview - research the company and your role.

Appearance

Dress professionally for an interview.

Behaviour

Make sure that you use positive body language, such as a firm hand shake, sit up straight and make eye contact. Don't take your mobile phone into an interview with you.

Sell yourself

Take a record of achievement file with you including your GCSE certificates. You can take notes into your

Before your interview

Practise answering interview questions with someone else. If you are at school or college, you may be able to arrange a mock interview.

Keep in mind the interviewer wants to find out about what you can offer them: the particular skills and qualities you can bring that set you apart from other applicants.

But it's not just about what the employer is looking for – try to think of some insightful questions you could ask, for example:

- Future opportunities for progression?
- Do you have a mentor scheme?
- What responsibilities would I start with if I was successful?
- How soon could I start?

On the day - breathe!

First impressions count!

Make sure you dress appropriately and look the part. Avoid elaborate jewellery, body piercings, excessive make up and hairstyles, etc.

Offer a firm handshake and make appropriate eye contact with the interviewer.

It's OK to take a moment to think through your response, and better to have a considered reply rather than a rushed answer. If you need more time to think about your answer, ask the interviewer to repeat the question. Don't let your nerves take hold of you, channel them and use them to your advantage!

Remember it's not enough to just say you're good at something - always try to provide examples.

It's fine to ask questions! Ask your prepared questions and anything that came up during the interview... Avoid JUST asking about your salary and benefits!

Commonly asked interview questions

Background on you...

- Tell me a bit about yourself?
- What do you like to do in your spare time? (hobbies etc)
- What is your current situation? (i.e. school, college, employed)
- Have you been given any responsibilities? (i.e. prefect etc)

Why should they hire you...

- What made you apply for this position?
- What do you know about the company?
- What can you bring to the company?
- What skills do you have that will help you in this

Can you give me an example of when...

- You worked as part of a team?
- You used your initiative?
- You worked under a pressure?
- You worked to a deadline?
- You multi-tasked successfully?

Self evaluation...

- What do you consider your strengths?
- What do you consider your weaknesses?
- What is your greatest achievement and why?

Future career plans...

- Where do you see yourself in five years time?
- Have you got a future career in mind?

CV tips

Use a positive tone throughout

Maintain a consistent font and use appropriate sizing

Keep it up to date with relevant information

Use a chronological order with work experience and qualifications (most recent first)

Keep it simple and clear

Spell check and use correct punctuation and grammar

Key things to include:

- Contact details
- Personal statement a short introduction to you
- Grades / education history
- Work experiences
- Work history (if it's not your first job)
- References
- Key skills

What happens next...

If you are successful in the interview:

- We will call you and offer you the Apprenticeship position





Starting university is an exciting new chapter
filled with opportunities and challenges. If you
have special educational needs or a disability
(SEND), you might feel uncertain about what to
expect. However, reat assured, UK universities
are dedicated to supporting you every step of
the way. This guide will introduce you to the
resources, adjustments, and services designed
to help you thrive and make the most of your
university experience.

Peclaring your disability

Your first step towards accessing support
is to declare your disability on your UCAS
application or directly to the university.
Many students worry this might affect their
application, but universities are legally
required under the Equality Act 2010 to treat
everyone fairly. Declaring your disability at

helps universities understand your needs and arrange reasonable adjustments to support your learning and university life from the very beginning.

The Disabled Students' Allowance
If you have additional needs due to a disability,
learning difficulty, or long-term health condition,
you can apply for the Disabled Students'
Allowance (DSA) (page 60). This non-repayable
grant can cover the cost of:

- non-medical helpers, such as a mentor or note-taker travel costs related to your disability specialist equipment, like a laptop with assistive software other resources tailored to your needs.

It's important to apply for the Disabled Students' Allowance (DSA) early, as the process can take some time. While it might seem overwhelming at first, universities are here to guide you through it. At the University of South Wales, for instance, you can connect with a Disablity Adviser during open days, taster assisting or through their dedicated email inbor, even before you enrol. These conversations ensure you have the support you need in place, ready for when you start your university journey.

APPRENTICE INSIGHT

Heather's apprenticeship story



Heather aspired to be a sports photographer, however, half-way through university her life changed and so did her career direction. Find out how an apprenticeship at Specsavers got Heather back on track for a satisfying and rewarding career path.

At school, I studied photography, PE, and media which I really enjoyed. Once I'd completed my education, I thought I should go to university as my friends were all going to university too. So, I applied to a university to study photography and was accepted. I moved away from home and lived local to the university. At first it was fine but after a while, I felt unhappy. The subject itself wasn't what I thought it would be – it was a lot of theoretical studies and no actual hands-on photography.

Not wanting to give up on my education, I requested a subject change to sports (as I'm a rugby player already and really enjoy getting stuck in). For some reason, I still didn't get on well with it and found study time difficult. I was in a quandary – wondering why were my friends getting on so well at university and I wasn't.

Then, my life took a bit of a turn when I suddenly became ill. This caused me to have to drop out of university on medical grounds, so that decision was taken away from me. When I started to get better, the thought of going back to university filled me with dread. I'd already been back home for a while whilst I was recovering, so I thought I'd explore my options. This is when I saw an Apprentice Optical Assistant being advertised at my local Specsavers.

I'd never considered an apprenticeship before as I didn't know anyone who had done one, so I didn't really know what to expect. But it sounded really interesting, and the advert alluded to the possibility of having a rewarding clinical or retail career which piqued my interest.

My illness had unfortunately affected my eyesight, which then made me more aware of and interested in eye health. So, when I saw the apprenticeship opportunity where I could learn more about eye care, it really resonated with me. I also love learning and doing things at the same time. I was so excited to be successful - and it's certainly exceeded my expectations. I get 1-1 coaching with my apprenticeship coach, ample study time, interesting theory work as well as practical experience, and it's opened the door to so many wonderful career opportunities.

I've completed my mock exam and am finishing off the last few subjects before booking in my end-point assessment. Specsavers have supported me all the way through my apprenticeship and are happy with me completing it early as I feel ready. Once completed, I'll become an Optical Assistant. For now I'll look to do a qualification to become a Dispensing Optician. Who knows, further down the line I might continue my studies while working at Specsavers to become a qualified optometrist. I know my store partner is fully supportive of my goals and wants to see me succeed.

Even though my career path is very different to what I thought it would be, I'm excited to see what the future holds. I'm grateful my apprenticeship has enabled me to retrain and learn new skills to lead me down a different path. If you're in a similar situation, or you want to change your career path later on in life, then an apprenticeship is an excellent way to do it. There's always time, it's never too late.



Getting medical work experience

If you are a student planning to apply to medical school or a doctor who is about to take on a student for work experience, our guidance will help you to get the most out of work experience placements.

Work experience in a caring or service role is now an essential step when getting into medical school. Medical schools will be looking for students who have gained a broad range of healthcare experience. Both students and doctors should use the advice and resources below to guide them through the process.

Advice for students

All UK medical schools now require applicants to have experience in a caring or service role, either paid or voluntarily, in health or related field, as well as direct observation healthcare.

You can get a placement in a range of healthcare settings, such as a GP practice, hospital or even internationally.

Keep in mind that it will take some time. You may need to apply to many places before you get a positive response.

How to get a placement

Get in touch with GP practices. Contact practice managers and GPs to explain who you are and ask for their help. Many will ask you to complete an application form.

Make the most of any contacts you have, such as relatives, neighbours or friends who work in healthcare or in a hospital.

If you can't shadow a doctor, look at shadowing another healthcare professional like a pharmacist or physiotherapist.

Organisations that can help

There are a number of organisations that can help you to get a voluntary placement in a caring role, some of these include:

- Volunteering England
- Kissing it Better
- St John Ambulance
- Royal College of General Practitioners

The BMA does not encourage healthcare professionals to charge students for placements, although there may be instances where you could be asked to cover costs such as administration. Don't be afraid to ask what, if any, costs you may be asked to pay before starting your placement.

Top tips when on a placement

- Dress smartly as you would for a job interview.
- Be aware that some patients may wish to be seen without a student present. Don't take this personally.
- Remember that patient confidentiality is important. You must not, under any circumstances, discuss patient
 issues outside of the department or practice you are based in. Be aware that you may be asked to sign a
 confidentiality agreement.
- It would be inappropriate for you to see a patient that is known to you socially, whether it be a family member or friend. If this happens you should tell the person who is supervising you and leave the room.
- Make sure you tell your placement what you expect to get out of it and let them know if there is anything that you would like to do or learn whilst you're there.
- Keep a log/ daily diary of what you did and saw. This can help solidify what you learn, but is also an important reference tool when you are writing a personal statement and preparing for your medical school interviews.
- Try to speak to a diverse range of staff. Time with other healthcare workers can offer a great insight into the multi-disciplinary approach to healthcare.
- Ask questions and show enthusiasm. Ask the doctors about what they think are the qualities of a good doctor, ask them about their work patterns, lifestyle or whether they would choose medicine again as a career.
- Talk to patients remember to be polite and introduce yourself as a medical school applicant on work experience.
- Be proactive and offer a pair of helping hands at every opportunity.



Chef

You'll need technical cooking skills, creativity and a passion for food to be a successful chef in a competitive industry that requires commitment and resilience.

As a chef, you'll prepare, cook and present high quality food that tastes great and is visually appealing. As you gain experience, you'll go beyond simply following recipes and will also create menus and develop new dishes.

As your career progresses you will also manage junior chefs and other kitchen staff, oversee food safety and hygiene practices, and control inventory and budgets. You will also have overall responsibility for the standard of food, quality and taste.

Whether working in a small independent restaurant or a prestigious Michelin-starred kitchen, you'll play a vital role in shaping memorable dining experiences.

Responsibilities

As a commis, apprentice or trainee chef, you'll build foundational kitchen skills and support more senior chefs by:

- learning basic cooking techniques, including measuring ingredients, knife skills and handling food safely
- checking stock levels, accepting deliveries and monitoring food expiry dates
- assisting the chef de partie with food preparation, basic cooking and plating across various stations
- keeping the kitchen area clean and tidy
- following instructions carefully and working effectively as part of a team.
- With experience, you can progress to first commis chef, taking on greater responsibility and more complex tasks

Working as a chef de partie or section chef, you'll:

- manage a designated kitchen station such as meat, sauces, fish or pastry
- supervise the preparation, cooking and assembling of dishes, making sure that they go
 out on time
- assist the sous chef or head chef in areas such as menu development
- carry out regular food safety and hygiene checks
- monitor stock levels, manage orders and work within set budgets
- delegate task to junior chefs

In a sous chef role, you will:

- carry out the head chef's vision and maintain high kitchen standards
- manage the day-to-day running of the kitchen, ensuring everything runs smoothly
- oversee food orders, inventory management and budgeting
- train and mentor junior kitchen staff
- oversee strict hygiene and cleanliness standards
- lead the kitchen when the head chef is away
- prepare and plate dishes and contribute to menu design

Operating as a head chef, executive chef or chef de cuisine, you'll:

- have ultimate responsibility for overall kitchen performance and reputation
- create a vision for the cuisine, setting high standards for food quality and presentation
- design innovative and inspiring menus
- taste and approve dishes to ensure consistency and excellence before service
- recruit, motivate and manage staff, creating a positive working environment
- inspire your team and delegate tasks effectively
- manage relationships with suppliers, oversee deliveries and manage the kitchen budget.
- In this role, you may spend less time cooking and more time managing, mentoring and driving the creative direction of the kitchen
