Year 10 will also visit two colleges in June/July for taster sessions. Pupils have already chosen their options for the days and they will receive individual timetables. These are always great days, allowing pupils to get a real feel for college life and the kind of subjects they will be able to study post-16.




STEM Roadshow for Year 7 and 8

Earlier this week, Year 7 and 8 were visited by Matt, Sophie and Kat - and Fluffy the cobot dog! A cobot is a collaborative robot, designed to work alongside humans, not replace them. Cobots are equipped with sensors and safety features that allow them to operate in shared workspaces with people without requiring protective barriers like traditional industrial robots. They are programmed for specific tasks, often repetitive or physically demanding ones, freeing up human workers for more complex or creative tasks.

During the roadshow, pupils also contributed to creating an AI hit song and music video, the results of which will be shared next week! Thanks to the team and their sponsors for an amazing experience.





Individual Challenger Experience

The Individual Challenger Activities are an exciting way for students aged 11-16 to complete a short STEM project from home and gain an Industrial Cadets Challenger award. Each activity is designed by our educational experts and allows students to use their creativity and imagination to complete a project in their own way and at their own pace. Students are guided through the activity on our learning platform and will have access to support for any questions or queries along the way. All students will get individual feedback on their project.

Carbon Capture - Eco Garden project

TinkerCAD Moon Base Project

This course is designed to help you create a 3D design using a CADprogram. You will be able to investigate and learn how to create a 3D moonbase, fit for astronauts, whilst learning more about the best place to setup abase on the moon. Please keep in mind you will need an email address to log into TinkerCAD- this can be your own email or a parent/carer's email.

By the end of this course, you'll have a clear understanding of how to use a CAD program whilst deepening your understanding of space.

Once students have completed an Individual Industrial Cadets Challenger activity, they will join our alumni network and receive priority information about future EDT and Industrial Cadets activities.



Ben is a former T Level student, a current apprentice and also studying for an HTQ!



T Level in Design, Surveying and Planning for Construction

I studied GCSEs in engineering, geography and computer science and always wanted to get into some kind of engineering. As I went through secondary school I decided on structural engineering as the specialism I wanted to focus on. The T Level in Design, Surveying and Planning for **Construction at Weston College** suited me because it was local and focused on the sector I wanted, as well as being a technical course. My T Level placement was with Hydrock, an engineering consultancy. This placement solidified my interest in engineering and I am still working and learning with Hydrock today.



Structural Technician Apprenticeship

After my T Level, I considered doing a full-time university degree. I had completed my UCAS application for civil engineering courses at different universities and I actually got accepted for all my UCAS options. But at the same time, while I was doing my T Level placement, I learnt about Hydrock's apprenticeships, and they had applications open.

I knew this would be a path where I get qualified, and although it might take longer, I also get paid to do it. I was offered the apprenticeship position with Hydrock and I accepted.



HTQ - Level 4 Civil Engineering Higher National Certificate (HNC)

For the off-the-job learning part of my apprenticeship, I am studying for an HTQ in Civil Engineering. I have a keen interest in the built environment and would like to work on global construction projects, so the HTQ is a good logical next step to gain a qualification in these interests. I am in the workplace at Hydrock Tuesday-Friday and spend Mondays at college studying for my HTQ.

I think an engineering HTQ is a good next step for people who know what sector they want to thrive in and want to make a clear plan on how to get there.

APPRENTICESHIPS RUN IN OUR FAMILY!

Lynette is the proud parent of a former apprentice, Tom, and a current apprentice, Millie, who she says couldn't be more different to each other, but have both ended up doing apprenticeships.

Tom is really academic – he got excellent GCSE results and then went off to college to do A-levels. He was adamant he didn't want to go to university. He wanted to work and didn't want to get into debt through paying fees. At first, he wanted to find a degree apprenticeship and he was worried that a lower-level apprenticeship wouldn't be enough of a step up from A-levels. I had to explain to him that it's not a sideways step - you're learning about that particular job and getting the hands-on learning that that you need to progress in that career. He found a Level 4 Construction Design and Build Technician apprenticeship and realised he really loved the project management side of construction. He finished his apprenticeship and still works for the company – they are now paying for him to do a Construction Project Management degree at Salford University alongside working. He's absolutely thriving – he's got a company car, he's always off on holiday - he wouldn't be in this position if he hadn't done an apprenticeship.

Millie left school after her GCSEs. She's not academic – she's a hands-on learner with a really strong work ethic. She enrolled onto a level 2 Childcare course at college and worked hard to achieve her functional skills in maths over the summer. We started looking into apprenticeships for when she finished college, but a Level 2 Early Years Practitioner apprenticeship opportunity came up with The Growth Company that was starting straight away, and she ended up going for it and getting the role! We had to weigh up the pros and cons of her leaving college before her course finished. She didn't really enjoy the college side of her course, but loved the placement side, so it felt like the right thing for her. As a parent, you don't want your child 'dropping out', but we didn't see it like that, we saw it as her making the right choice for her progression. She's getting on really well at the nursery, the kids love her, and she's grown up so much being in a full-time job.

CV stands for curriculum vitae. That's Latin for your 'course of life' and that's basically what the document does. It tells people who you are and what you've done up to the point of applying.

What should your CV include?

- Name
- Contact details
- Personal profile
- Key skills
- Education
- Work experience
- References
- Hobbies and interests/achievements

You DO NOT need to include your age, date of birth or nationality. Employers shouldn't consider those things when deciding to offer you an interview. You also don't need to include a photo.

What should your CV look like?

There's no need to try and stand out with jazzy fonts and fluorescent paper. Your CV should be clear and easy to read.

Your CV should:

- Be no longer than two pages.
- Use an easy-to-read font like Arial or Times New Roman. The font should be black and sized between 10-12.
- Use headings and bullet points. Keep the layout simple and make it easy to read.
- Use plain language.

Top tips for a successful interview



Plan your journey

Allow extra time and plan to arrive at least 15 minutes early. If you are unfamiliar with the location, do a test run.



Research, research and research!

Be prepared for the interview - research the company and your role.



Appearance

Dress professionally for an interview.

Behaviour

Make sure that you use positive body language, such as a firm hand shake, sit up straight and make eye contact. Don't take your mobile phone into an interview with you.



Sell yourself

Take a record of achievement file with you including your GCSE certificates. You can take notes into your interview.

Before your interview

Practise answering interview questions with someone else. If you are at school or college, you may be able to arrange a mock interview.

Keep in mind the interviewer wants to find out about what you can offer them: the particular skills and qualities you can bring that set you apart from other applicants.

But it's not just about what the employer is looking for – try to think of some insightful questions you could ask, for example:

- Future opportunities for progression?
- Do you have a mentor scheme?
- What responsibilities would I start with if I was successful?
- How soon could I start?

On the day - breathe!

First impressions count!

Make sure you dress appropriately and look the part. Avoid elaborate jewellery, body piercings, excessive make up and hairstyles, etc.

Offer a firm handshake and make appropriate eye contact with the interviewer.

It's OK to take a moment to think through your response, and better to have a considered reply rather than a rushed answer. If you need more time to think about your answer, ask the interviewer to repeat the question. Don't let your nerves take hold of you, channel them and use them to your advantage!

Remember it's not enough to just say you're good at something - always try to provide examples.

It's fine to ask questions! Ask your prepared questions and anything that came up during the interview... Avoid JUST asking about your salary and benefits!

- Tell me a bit about yourself?
- What do you like to do in your spare time? (hobbies etc)
- What is your current situation? (i.e. school, college, employed)
- Have you been given any responsibilities? (i.e. prefect etc)

Why should they hire you...

- What made you apply for this position?
- What do you know about the company?
- What can you bring to the company?
- What skills do you have that will help you in this role?

Can you give me an example of when...

- You worked as part of a team?
- You used your initiative?
- You worked under a pressure?
- You worked to a deadline?
- You multi-tasked successfully?

Self evaluation...

- What do you consider your strengths?
- What do you consider your weaknesses?
- What is your greatest achievement and why?

Future career plans...

- Where do you see yourself in five years time?
- Have you got a future career in mind?

However, rest assured, UK universities are dedicated to supporting you every step of resources, adjustments, and services designed to help you thrive and make the most of your university experience.

Declaring your disability

Declaring your disabany Your first step towards accessing support is to declare your disability on your UCAS application or directly to the university. Many students worry this might affect their application, but universities are legally required under the Equality Act 2010 to treat everyone fairly. Declaring your disability

helps universities understand your needs and arrange reasonable adjustments to support your learning and university life from the very beginning.

The Disabled Students' Allowance If you have additional needs due to a disability, learning difficulty, or long-term health condition, you can apply for the Disabled Students' Allowance (DSA) (page 60). This non-repayable grant can cover the cost of:

- non-medical helpers, such as a mentor or note-taker travel costs related to your disability specialist equipment, like a laptop with other resources tailored to your needs.

It's important to apply for the Disabled Students' Allowance (DSA) early as the process can take some time. While it might seem overwhelming at first, universities are here to guide you for instance, you can connect with a Disability Adviser during open days, taster sessions or through their dedicated email inbox, even before you ernol. These conversations ensure you have the support you need in place, ready for when you start your university journey.



Getting medical work experience

If you are a student planning to apply to medical school or a doctor who is about to take on a student for work experience, our guidance will help you to get the most out of work experience placements.

Work experience in a caring or service role is now an essential step when getting into medical school. Medical schools will be looking for students who have gained a broad range of healthcare experience. Both students and doctors should use the advice and resources below to guide them through the process.

Advice for students

All UK medical schools now require applicants to have experience in a caring or service role, either paid or voluntarily, in health or related field, as well as direct observation healthcare.

You can get a placement in a range of healthcare settings, such as a GP practice, hospital or even internationally.

Keep in mind that it will take some time. You may need to apply to many places before you get a positive response.

How to get a placement

Get in touch with GP practices. Contact practice managers and GPs to explain who you are and ask for their help. Many will ask you to complete an application form.

Make the most of any contacts you have, such as relatives, neighbours or friends who work in healthcare or in a hospital.

If you can't shadow a doctor, look at shadowing another healthcare professional like a pharmacist or physiotherapist.

Organisations that can help

There are a number of organisations that can help you to get a voluntary placement in a caring role, some of these include:

- Volunteering England
- Kissing it Better
- St John Ambulance
- Royal College of General Practitioners

The BMA does not encourage healthcare professionals to charge students for placements, although there may be instances where you could be asked to cover costs such as administration. Don't be afraid to ask what, if any, costs you may be asked to pay before starting your placement.

Top tips when on a placement

- Dress smartly as you would for a job interview.
- Be aware that some patients may wish to be seen without a student present. Don't take this personally.
- Remember that patient confidentiality is important. You must not, under any circumstances, discuss patient issues outside of the department or practice you are based in. Be aware that you may be asked to sign a confidentiality agreement.
- It would be inappropriate for you to see a patient that is known to you socially, whether it be a family member or friend. If this happens you should tell the person who is supervising you and leave the room.
- Make sure you tell your placement what you expect to get out of it and let them know if there is anything that you would like to do or learn whilst you're there.
- Keep a log/ daily diary of what you did and saw. This can help solidify what you learn, but is also an important reference tool when you are writing a personal statement and preparing for your medical school interviews.
- Try to speak to a diverse range of staff. Time with other healthcare workers can offer a great insight into the multi-disciplinary approach to healthcare.
- Ask questions and show enthusiasm. Ask the doctors about what they think are the qualities of a good doctor, ask them about their work patterns, lifestyle or whether they would choose medicine again as a career.
- Talk to patients remember to be polite and introduce yourself as a medical school applicant on work experience.
- Be proactive and offer a pair of helping hands at every opportunity.

Electrical engineer

Relevant industry experience and an accredited degree can significantly increase your chances of getting a job as an electrical engineer.

As an electrical engineer, you'll design, develop and maintain electrical systems and components to required specifications.

The electrical equipment that you'll design and manufacture is used across many sectors, including:

- the building industry and services, including lighting, heating and ventilation
- transportation and transport networks
- manufacturing and construction
- production and distribution of power
- renewable energy

You could be involved in projects from the concept and detail of the design, through to implementation, testing and handover. You may also work on maintenance programmes.

It's likely you'll work in multidisciplinary project teams, which can include engineers from other specialist areas as well as architects, marketing and sales staff, manufacturers, technicians and customer service personnel.


Responsibilities

The work can vary according to the industry and your employer, but typically you'll need to:

- identify customer requirements
- design systems and products
- read design specifications and technical drawings
- research suitable solutions and estimate costs and timescales
- make models and prototypes of products using threedimensional design software
- liaise with others in the design team
- communicate with clients and contractors
- attend meetings on site
- design and conduct tests
- record, analyse and interpret test data
- propose modifications and retest products
- qualify the final product or system
- service and maintain equipment
- prepare product documentation, write reports and give presentations
- monitor a product in use to improve on future design
