The Sophie Scholl Awards

“Someone has to make a start.” How about you?



Holocaust Memorial Day is commemorated each year on 27th January, the date of the liberation of the Nazi concentration camp Auschwitz-Birkenau in 1945. Holocaust Memorial Day remembers the millions of victims of the Nazi Holocaust, including six million Jews, and of other, more recent genocides.



The Sophie Scholl Awards were introduced at Runshaw as part of our events to commemorate Holocaust Memorial Day.

Holocaust Memorial Day. The courage of Sophie Scholl, of a similar age to Runshaw students, was an inspiration to us all. We now extend an invitation to pupils in partner high schools to help us celebrate the short life of this brave young woman by participating in awards reserved for them.

Sophie was 18 when the war started in 1939. She and her family, inspired by their strong religious beliefs, actively resisted the Nazis – an incredibly courageous thing for Germans to do. In 1942, Sophie, along with her brother Hans and a few other students, founded the White Rose, a non-violent resistance movement which painted anti-fascist slogans on walls, defaced Nazi emblems and distributed anti-war leaflets. In early 1943, Sophie and the other leaders of the group were caught, condemned as traitors and executed by beheading. Sophie was just 21.

During her trial, despite the attempts of the judge and prosecutors to browbeat and ridicule her, Sophie remained steadfast as one individual against the massive power of the Nazi state. “Someone has to make a start”, she said. Convinced that good in the end would prevail, her last words as she was led into the execution yard were, “The sun still shines!”

For many inspired by Sophie's example, a white rose has come to represent peace, justice and a love of humanity.

Students in partner high schools are asked to make an entry based on ONE of the following themes:

- The inspiration of Sophie Scholl
- The White Rose
- Someone has to make a start

Entries can be

- a written piece (maximum 250 words but could be much shorter)
- a poem
- a piece of art work or music – of any kind
- an idea to do something at school based on Sophie's example
- anything at all based on one of the above themes.

Entries can be individual or group work.

Crime scene investigator

Crime scene investigators gather forensic evidence from crime scenes to help identify and prosecute criminals.

As a crime scene investigator (CSI), you'll secure and protect crime scenes and collect evidence from crime scenes, post-mortems and other incidents, such as fires and suspicious deaths.

You'll be responsible for processing and categorising evidence so that it can be used in criminal investigations. This might include gathering photographic evidence or physical samples from the scene, such as weapons, fingerprints, clothing or biological evidence.

Crime scene investigators are sometimes known as scenes of crime officers or forensic scene investigators.

Responsibilities

As a crime scene investigator, you'll need to:

- respond to calls from the police to attend crime scenes
- preserve a crime scene so that evidence is accurate and doesn't become contaminated
- work closely with the police - including the National Counter Terrorism Security Office (NaCTSO) and the British Transport Police, forensic scientists and other organisations such as the National Crime Agency
- take a lead in finding evidence that may support a later criminal case
- photograph and video the incident you're attending
- use scientific methods to gather biological evidence
- carefully record and catalogue evidence found at the crime scene such as samples of blood, hair or fibres from clothing
- examine crime scenes for latent finger impressions
- take imprints of evidence, such as footprints or tyre prints
- write reports
- attend court to give evidence as part of a trial process

What to expect

You may attend incidents that can be upsetting and will need to be able to focus on the task despite difficult circumstances.

The work is likely to be varied, and you'll need to expect the unexpected. Much of your time will be spent at the location of the scene, but you'll come back to the police station to store evidence and write reports of your findings.

You'll work in many environments and will travel to incident scenes. At times, this will involve being in all weathers and sometimes in difficult and maybe hostile situations.

Evidence must be handled with care and prepared for the forensic team to run laboratory tests. Time and place details must be recorded accurately before evidence is passed to the lab for processing.

To do well in the role, you'll need to be passionate about providing a service to the public and understand the needs of different communities.
