



Paper was first made in China 2,000 years ago.



Fast-growing trees like **eucalyptus** and **pine** are used to make paper.




Cellulose (a strong fibre) is extracted from plants to make paper.



Pulp (a mix of plant fibre and water) is spread, pressed and dried to produce sheets.



5 litres of water are needed to make **1 sheet** of A4 paper.



So what is #SoMuchMoreThanTalkingAboutJobs? It's a fantastic campaign started by 2 fantastic careers professionals, Katherine Jennick and Bella Doswell. The purpose of the campaign is to raise public awareness of what careers professionals do.



Parent Post

Many people know that negative views of careers professions often stem from experiences of outdated, impractical, or uninspiring guidance, this is one reason I usually use the term careers professional rather than the 'old term' of careers adviser. To give a little space for reassessment of what careers guidance means in the 21st Century.

When people hear the phrase "careers guidance", it is easy to picture a one-off chat about job titles or a quick conversation about what a young person wants to be when they grow up. This often stems from experience of the 'old style' tick box approach which was prevalent in the 70s and 80s and is constantly regurgitated anecdotally in the press and via word of mouth. In reality, good careers guidance is about much more than that.

A qualified careers guidance professional, RCDP, helps young people make sense of themselves, their options and the world they are growing into. That support can make a real difference to confidence, motivation and future choices.

It starts with understanding your child, not pushing a job

Careers guidance is not about telling a young person what they should do, or even could do. A good careers professional starts by listening. They help your child explore their interests, strengths, worries and ambitions, including the things they might not yet have words for.

For some young people, this is the first time an adult has sat down with them and focused entirely on them as an individual, rather than on grades, behaviour or targets. This is a powerful moment which can lead to huge changes in mindset, ambition and/or confidence.

It helps young people make sense of choices

Young people are faced with important decisions earlier than ever. Subject options, post-16 pathways, apprenticeships, college, sixth form or training. These choices can feel overwhelming, both for students and for parents.

A careers guidance professional helps your child understand the pros and cons of different routes, how choices link together and what doors they keep open. This is about clarity, not pressure.

It builds confidence and motivation

Many young people struggle to see the point of school when they cannot connect learning to their future. Careers guidance helps them understand why their education matters and how it links to real opportunities.

When a young person can see a purpose, confidence often grows. That can lead to better engagement in lessons, improved attendance and a more positive outlook overall.

It provides impartial, expert advice

Parents play a vital role in supporting their children, but it can be hard to keep up with a fast-changing education and employment landscape. This often leads to well meaning but ineffectual or downright wrong advice. In the worst cases, the advice can inflict years of stagnated growth and ambition leading to poor academic and working life outcomes. Careers guidance professionals are trained to understand qualifications, pathways and local opportunities and thus avoid these pitfalls.

Their advice is impartial. It is not about promoting a particular route or outcome, but about helping your child find what is right for them, based on accurate, up-to-date information.

It supports wellbeing, not just progression

Careers conversations often uncover anxieties about the future, fear of failure or worries about not fitting in. A careers guidance professional can help young people articulate these concerns and think through practical next steps.

Feeling heard and understood can reduce stress and help young people feel more in control of their future.

It supports parents too

Careers guidance does not replace parental support. It complements it. Many parents find that having an external professional involved reassures them that their child is getting balanced advice and has someone neutral to talk things through with.

It can also help families have more productive conversations at home, with shared language and clearer understanding of options.

So much more than talking about jobs

Careers guidance is about helping young people develop self-awareness, resilience and the ability to make informed decisions. It is about preparing them not just for their first step after school, but for a future where they may change direction many times.

That is why a careers guidance professional speaking to your child can be such a valuable part of their education. It is not a quick chat about jobs. It is an investment in their confidence, clarity and long-term success.

Follow multiple patients over a 6-month period, as they go from their initial injury to recovery. It is amazing how many different healthcare professionals are involved in a patient's care. This incredible opportunity showcases a variety of professionals in one day. It gives students a chance to see them in action in various settings from the ward to the community. It is also a fantastic opportunity to see them work together in a multidisciplinary team.

During the work experience day, students will follow 2 patients from their initial presentation to recovery. Students will observe the healthcare professionals as they interact with the patients and also each other. Students will have an opportunity to ask questions and gain knowledge through teaching. This will help students to make an informed career decision as well as learn about how healthcare professionals work together as part of a multidisciplinary team. Chemical engineer

Chemical engineers develop raw materials into a range of useful products. A career in this field could involve you creating petrochemicals, medicine and plastics.

As a chemical engineer, you'll be involved in the design and development of a range of products. Your work will focus on changing the chemical, biochemical and physical state of a substance to turn it into something else, such as making plastic from oil.

You'll need to understand how to alter raw materials into required products, while taking into consideration health and safety and cost issues.

Modern chemical engineering is also concerned with pioneering valuable new materials and techniques, such as nanotechnology, fuel cells and biomedical engineering.

Types of chemical engineering

You can work in a variety of industries, including:

- energy
- food and drink
- oil and gas
- pharmaceuticals
- plastics
- toiletries
- water treatment

Responsibilities

Your daily activities will be extremely diverse and largely depend on the role and the sector in which you work. However, you'll generally need to:

- work closely with process chemists and control engineers to ensure the process plant is set up to provide maximum output levels and efficient running of the production facility
- design plant and equipment configuration so that they can be readily adapted to suit the product range and the process technologies involved, taking environmental and economic aspects into account
- set up scale-up and scale-down processes, including making appropriate changes, to equipment design and configuration
- assess options for plant expansion or reconfiguration by developing and testing process simulation models
- design, install and commission new production plants, including monitoring developments and troubleshooting
- optimise production by analysing processes and compiling debottleneck studies
- apply new and emerging technologies
- research new products from trial through to commercialisation, and improve product lines
- ensure that potential safety issues related to the project operator, the environment, the process and the product are considered at all stages.

Examples of work activities in specific sectors include:

- undertaking small and intermediate-scale manufacturing and packaging activities in pharmaceutical product development for clinical trial purposes
- developing new methods of safe nuclear energy production, including projects such as conceptual design, simulation and construction of test rigs, and detailed design and operations support
