This term's cluster topic. *The Assessment Minefield – effective assessments for SENDCOs. ADys Specialists Ltd.*

With 1000's of assessments out there on the market, how do we know which ones to choose? Do we stick with the 'ever-faithful's' passed down from SENDCo to SENDCo, or do we go with one of the glossy leaflets that appears in our pigeon hole at the start of the financial year?

The aim of the session will be to explore a range of assessments looking at their strengths and weaknesses along with cost (some even free!) to allow SENDCO's to make an informed judgement that meets the needs of their school and most importantly the children. The input is planned to support the publication and distribution at the cluster of the Lancashire and Sefton SENDco directory. With ever changing regulations on the administration of different assessments, it is key that SENDCOs know who can administer and what qualifications, if any, are required.

LEHSS free 'Train the Trainer'



The Lancashire Emotional Health in Schools Service free "train the trainer"

The Lancashire Emotional Health in Schools Service (LEHSS) is funded by Lancashire County Council Public Health department and delivers training and support to Lancashire primary and secondary schools on key topics relating to mental health. The service aims to help staff feel more skilled and confident in identifying, understanding and supporting children's mental health difficulties. The work is delivered by a small team of experienced clinical psychologists based at Lancaster University, who provide a combination of training and individualised support to staff, as well as workshops for pupils and parents.

LEHSS has been funded by LCC for four years, and to date has delivered training to staff in over 70% of the secondary schools in the county. From this year the service has been expanded to offer training and support to primary schools, working via a 'train the trainer' model for key staff.

All work with schools is free of charge.

Assessment and Intervention – Part 1

Lancashire and Sefton SENDcos Assessment and Interventions Directory

With the support of the SEND School Improvement Service, over 200 Lancashire and Sefton Primary and Secondary SENDcos have compiled a directory of their commonly used assessments and interventions. This directory includes information on costs, effectiveness and suitability to support a range of needs; it is intended to be a local directory to be used alongside other assessment and intervention information. The directory will be reviewed each term at cluster meeting by SENDcos with an electronic copy for each participant.

Assessment and Intervention – Part 2



SEN support: research evidence on effective approaches and examples of current practice in good and outstanding schools and colleges

This resource provides leaders, teachers and practitioners with access to information about evidence-based practice that can be effective for SEN support. It brings together in one place evidence from academic research papers, a survey of schools and post-16 institutions and a set of commissioned case studies in order to allow practitioners to look at the detail of interventions and approaches and consider what would be most beneficial in their setting and for their learners.

This resource was developed by ASK Research and Coventry University, and was funded by the Department for Education.

Assessment and Intervention – Part 3

Literacy and numeracy catch-up strategies-DfE November 2017

This paper reviews catch-up strategies and interventions which are intended for low-attaining pupils in literacy or numeracy at the end of key stage 2. It starts with a definition of low attainment which distinguishes it from SEND but there are strategies and interventions also applicable to SEND pupils and only includes programmes where independent analysis has provided an assessment of their effectiveness. This includes interventions which have been trialled with low-attaining year 7 pupils, or interventions which have been trialled and proved successful with younger or older pupils.

Professional Teaching Standards for TAs

These 2016 standards have been discussed at previous clusters but I wanted to highlight them again in the term that most teachers are also having professional discussions around performance linked to published standards with their line managers. They are applicable to all teaching assistants in schools, working at all levels.

It is hoped these standards will support and shape positive conversations teaching assistants have with colleagues, managers and headteachers around their own roles and professional development. These teaching assistant standards are non-mandatory and non-statutory, but they sit alongside the statutory standards for teachers and headteachers and help to define the role and purpose of teaching assistants to ensure that schools can maximise the educational value and contribution of employees working directly with pupils.

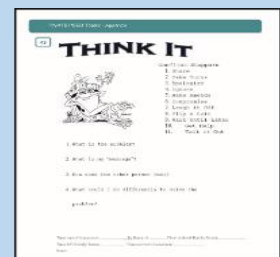
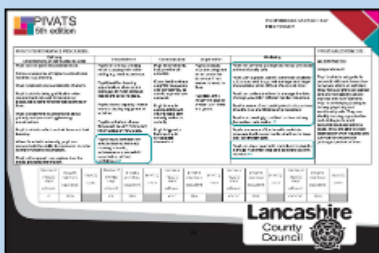
