Health Education England has recently completed a discovery report on virtual work experience programmes, that have concluded that these programmes are a valuable adjunct to in-person work experience, especially in our current climate where in-person experiences are extremely limited.

The NHS Allied Healthcare Work Experience successfully invited 12,000 students to participate in the last academic year, making it the largest programme for students who are specifically interested in the following careers: Nursing, Midwifery, Paramedicine, Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy, Dietetics, Radiography, Prosthetics and Orthotics, Speech and language therapy and Pharmacy.

Applications for this programme are now open, and they will be open throughout this academic year, with the **first programme taking place on the 3rd October!**

During the work experience day, students will follow 2 patients from their initial presentation to recovery. Students will observe the healthcare professionals as they interact with the patients and each other. Students will have an opportunity to ask questions and gain knowledge through teaching. This will help students to make an informed career decision as well as learn about how healthcare professionals work together as part of a multidisciplinary team.

Each work experience day is completely different and students will be able to build on their knowledge of NHS careers as they see different patient cases and healthcare professionals work in a variety of settings, such as hospital and community.

Students will also receive certificates as evidence of having participated in the work experience programme. Those that complete the entire 6-month programme will be awarded with Highly Commended References too. Students can register individually through the website link below.

LJMU to build world's largest robotic telescope

Liverpool John Moores University will start work on the world's largest robotic telescope after a £4 million boost from the Science and Technology Facilities Council (STFC).

The £24 million, four-metre-diameter telescope will be four times more sensitive and ten times faster than the previous record-holder.

The fully robotic telescope will respond quickly to explosive and rapidly-fading astronomical events, offering new opportunities for astronomers globally to understand the Universe.

The New Robotic Telescope (NRT) will be built by an international consortium led by the UK's Liverpool John

Moores University (LJMU), Spain's University of Oviedo and the Institute of Astrophysics of the Canary Islands (IAC).

Dr Chris Copperwheat, LT Astronomer in Charge at LJMU's Astrophysics Research Institute, said: "Speed is key and gives us a view of mysteries of the Universe which have never been observed before.

"So much happens in the night sky that we simply miss because we are on to it too late. The NRT will give us an almost immediate eye onto movements and phenomena, giving us an unprecedented insight into the physics of the changing sky."



Virtual Work Experience Days

Last year some of our students participated in the <u>largest virtual work experience programme for aspiring medics</u>, <u>dentists and veterinary students</u>. These programmes were used by 15,000 students in the last academic year, to help them make an informed decision about their careers.

It is also the largest widening access programme in the country, because it is **free for any student** from any background. The virtual work experience programme was a resounding success, and feedback from students and teachers has been overwhelmingly positive.

Health Education England have also acknowledged that virtual work experience programmes are an excellent adjunct to in-person work experience, and we believe that they are also valuable because of their accessibility to all. The Medical Schools will also be accepting virtual work experience as valuable insight opportunities as part of applications this year.






dentsu Rise Up Challenge

The Importance of Networking and Why You Should Grow Your Contact List

Who has the time every single day to think about their professional network? Probably no one, but you should always be conscious of what is happening in your network and taking small steps to grow it for your own professional benefit. Keeping in contact with people you have met at past jobs, networking events or even people you would love to speak to is the key to helping your career now and in the future. At the moment, we all know the importance of being online and keeping active in your community, but there are more ways than one to build a successful network. Networking doesn't just mean talking to people at events, it can be online, through social media and online work events. It can even mean simply branching out to a new team in your company to meet and engage with new people. You never know who you will meet and how they can help you.

Let's start with LinkedIn

LinkedIn tends to be where most people start when thinking about their network of contacts and this platform can be one of the easier and more efficient ways of meeting and talking to new people. LinkedIn allows you to find people from your company, past employers, recruiters, and anyone you think that can benefit you. You are able to connect with friends and people from university, typically people you don't necessarily think would be good for your network, but these are the people that can connect you to a whole new world of people.

As well as connecting with other people, you can share relevant news, comment and like other people's posts. There is also a news section, which can help you keep up to date with industry news and articles.

You can use LinkedIn like a virtual CV if you prefer. You can update your profile with job history, qualifications and share information about yourself that can interest recruiters and employers. A lot of job seekers are actually putting a link to their LinkedIn page on their CV, so the employer can learn a little bit more about them. Others can see your likes, posts and how you interact with others on the platform, which can show an employer more about you than a CV can sometimes.

Events

Being invited to an in-person event can feel like a thing of the past, but they will be making a come back and you should be ready for them. Until that time comes, virtual events have grown in popularity. One event that can be important if you're job seeking, are job fairs and recruitment events. Even if you don't think there is a particular job that stands out to you, simply going and speaking to other people in a business and recruiters can set you up nicely. Just because there isn't anything on offer that sparks your interest now, doesn't mean there won't be in the near future. Getting out there, or going online to share your interest, can make you memorable if you do ever apply for a role with a specific company.

Other industry events can be a great place to find likeminded professionals in your field. Events can often consist of seminars, panels of professionals and a lot of time to talk to colleagues and other professionals in your sector.



These events are created so that people can take some time to learn more about their chosen industry and so companies can find potential employees. You all chose to be there and talking to new people can help you in your own career. It can reassure you that you have chosen the correct route for yourself and can be incredibly inspiring when you talk to other individuals that have the same passion you do about your field. Talking to new people can also result in you finding something new you may want to explore, creating new ideas and potential job routes. Simply talking to someone new can bring new ideas and creativity to explore. It's worth asking for people's contact details while you attend events like these to ensure you can reach them again, it's likely they would like to add you to their network as well.

So, why is your network so important?

One of the main benefits of networking is the impact it can have on your career. When you get out there (or online) and make the effort to talk to new people, employers etc. you are showing that you are passionate about your career. Investing in these relationships can help you in the future. By communicating and connecting with a wide array of people you can stay on top of the job market, understand trends in your area of expertise and overall talk to people you wouldn't usually get the chance to. It gives you a great number of resources for career development without you even realising. Whether that be working with or for them in the future or simply having a source to put in a good word about you can work wonders. Never underestimate the power of good communication.

Building a good network of supportive people isn't only good for your career, but it can help your mental health. Simply talking to people that understand you can go a really long way. Building your network is something that can take a substantial amount of time, but you should never really stop. Looking for opportunities and people that you think could help you (and you can help them) will help you grow and develop as a person. That is why networking can be so important to a person and not just their career.
