fluctuate (verb)

To *fluctuate* means to change continually, to shift back and forth, to vary irregularly.

Fluctuate is derived from the Latin 'fluere', which means 'to flow'...

... this then became 'fluctuat' meaning undulations or waves, and then *fluctuate*.

An antonym of fluctuate is to be *steady*.

(So something that fluctuates is not steady).

The air temperature in England *fluctuates* during the summer months.

The popularity of the Spice Girls has *fluctuated* over the course of their career.
