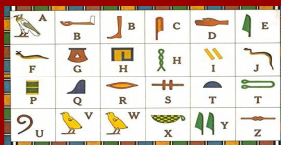

WORLD'S FIRST AFFORDABLE CAR

Ford's First Model T Rolls off the Production Line

The Model T was introduced to the world on the 27th September 1908. Henry Ford wanted the Model T to be affordable, simple to operate, and durable. The vehicle was one of the first mass production vehicles, allowing Ford to achieve his aim of manufacturing the first universal car. Henry Ford set up his new car factory in 1903 and the T was the twentieth model he designed. It was manufactured on the Ford Motor Company's moving assembly line at the revolutionary new Highland Park Plant in Detroit, Michigan. Due to the mass production of the vehicle, Ford Motor Company could sell the vehicle for \$260 - the equivalent of \$7000 or £5000 today - because Ford could pass the production savings on to his customers. The Model T was first tested by Henry Ford himself. He took the car on a hunting trip to Wisconsin and northern Michigan. The Model T became famous for the stunts it could perform which included climbing the stairs of the State Capitol building in Nashville, Tennessee. It was also driven to the top of the 4302 metre high Pikes Peak in Colorado. The vehicle was handed over to its first customer on 1st October 1908. On 26th May 1927, Henry, then aged 64, and his son Edsel drove the 15 millionth Model T out of the factory on the car's last day in production. Nobody is quite sure how many are left but there are estimated to be over 10,000 Ts still on the road almost 100 years after production stopped.

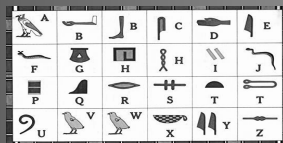

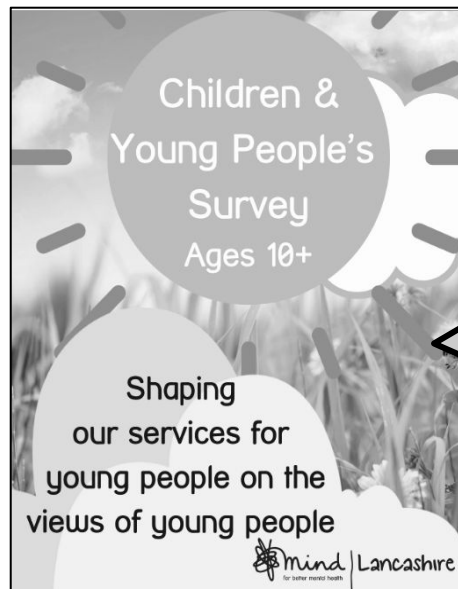
