Historical Fact of the Week On this day in 1963 ASSASSIN KILLS JOHN F. KENNED

Lyndon B. Johnson Sworn In As U.S. President

On 21st November 1963, President John Fitzgerald Kennedy and First Lady Jacqueline departed on Air Force One for a two-day, five-city tour of Texas, Just before noon on the next day the presidential Boeing 707 landed at Love Field airport in Dallas.

One hour later, crowds of excited people lined the streets of downtown Dallas waving. The open top Lincoln Continental, carrying the Kennedys with the Governor of Texas, John Connally and his wife Nellie, turned off Main Street at Dealey Plaza around 12.30pm. As it was passing the Texas School Book Depository, gunshots suddenly echoed across the plaza. Bullets struck the president's neck and head and he slumped over toward Mrs. Kennedy. Governor Connally was shot in the back.

The car sped off to Parkland Memorial Hospital just a few minutes away but little could be done to save the President. A Catholic priest was summoned to administer the last rites, and at 1:00 pm John F. Kennedy was pronounced dead. Though seriously wounded, Governor Connally would recover.

The President's body was brought back to Love Field and placed on Air Force One. Before the plane took off, the tall, grim figure of Lyndon B. Johnson stood in a crowded compartment and took the Oath of Office to become the new President of the United States. The brief ceremony took place at 2.38pm.

Less than an hour earlier, Dallas police had arrested Lee Harvey Oswald, an employee at the Texas School Book Depository. He was being held for the assassination of President Kennedy and the fatal shooting, shortly afterwards, of police officer J. D. Tippit on a Dallas street.

On the morning of Sunday 24th November, Oswald was scheduled to be transferred from police headquarters to the county jail. Viewers across America watching the live television coverage suddenly saw a man emerge from the crowd and shoot Oswald once at close range. The gunman was identified as Jack Ruby, a local nightclub owner. Oswald's death was announced just after 1pm.
