

Historical Fact of the Week On this day in 1984 APPLE MACINTOSH COMPUTER INTRODUCED First Successful Mass Market Self-Contained Desktop

The Macintosh, or Mac, is a series of personal computers, manufactured by Apple Inc. The first Macintosh was introduced on 24th January 1984, by Steve Jobs and it was the first commercially successful personal computer to feature two existing, but then unpopular features — the mouse and the graphical user interface. This improved upon the command-line interface of its predecessors.

Apple manufactured all aspects of the Macintosh's hardware and created its own operating system which was pre-installed on all Macintosh computers. This was in contrast to most of the IBM compatible competition who used multiple companies to create hardware intended to run their own operating system. Apple exclusively produced Macintosh hardware, developed the operating system and other software, created their own stylish designs, and set prices.

The Macintosh project started in the late 1970s when Jef Raskin, an Apple employee, envisioned an easy-to-use, low-cost computer for the average consumer. He wanted to name the computer after his favorite type of apple, the McIntosh, although the name had to be changed slightly for legal reasons - hence "Macintosh". In September 1979, Raskin was authorized by Steve Jobs, the founder of Apple, to start hiring for the project. Burrell Smith, a service technician who had only been hired a few months earlier, put together the prototype. Raskin fell out with Jobs and left Apple in 1981 so the final design was down to Jobs and became known as the 128k. It went on sale at £1,784 - the equivalent of a hefty £5,864 at today's prices.

Steve Jobs had left Apple in 1985. By the time he returned to the company in 1997 there were 20 different MacIntosh models. Jobs rebranded the computers as "Macs" and reduced the line-up to just four models. They were all commercially successful and returned Apple to the profitability it has maintained to this very day. On 3rd January 2022 Apple became the first company in the world to attain a market valuation of \$3 trillion.


