Historical Fact of the Week On this day in 1939 NATIONALISTS ENTER MADRID IN TRIUMPH Spanish Civil War Comes to an End

In Spain, on the 28th March 1939, the Republican defenders of Madrid raised white flags to surrender and bring the bloody Spanish Civil War to an end

Eight years earlier, King Alfonso XIII approved elections to decide the new government of Spain. The king had previously supported the unpopular dictatorship of Primo de Rivera so voters overwhelmingly chose to abolish the monarchy in favor of a liberal republic. Alfonso went into exile and the Second Republic, initially dominated by middle-class liberals and moderate socialists, was proclaimed.

At first, there were widespread liberal reforms and the independence-minded Spanish regions of Catalonia and the Basque Country achieved virtual autonomy. The aristocracy, church, and a large part of the military began to use violence in their opposition of the Second Republic.

On 17th July 1936 General Francisco Franco led a right-wing army revolt in Morocco, which divided Spain into two opposing camps: the Nationalists and the Republicans. Franco's Nationalist forces rapidly overran much of the Republican-controlled areas in central and northern Spain. Catalonia, with its capital city Barcelona, became the Republican heartland.

By 1937, Franco had unified the Nationalist forces under the command of Spain's fascist party. Germany and Italy supplied Franco with planes, tanks, and guns, while the USSR aided the Republicans. In addition, volunteers from France, the USSR, USA, UK and other countries formed the International Brigades who fought for the Republicans.

In June 1938, the Nationalists split the Republican territory in to when they reached the Mediterranean Sea. Franco's forces attacked Catalonia. On the 26th January, Barcelona was captured, and soon the rest of Catalonia fell. The Republicans tried to broker a peace deal but Franco refused. Reinforced by the International Brigades, Madrid had been defended but on 28th March 1939, the victorious Nationalists entered the city in triumph, and the Spanish Civil War came to an end. At least half a million lives were lost in the conflict. General Franco ruled Spain as Dictator until his death in 1975 when democracy and the monarchy were restored.
