Further to the publication of the secondary school league tables, Parklands is delighted to announce that our GCSE results from 2018 place us as the 8th best high school in the whole of Lancashire when compared to similar truly comprehensive, non-selective, non-religious mixed-sex schools. Whilst we are not an exams factory and we provide a holistic education, we are nonetheless proud of the excellent progress of our class of 2018!

Following the completion of the Science mock examinations, topics that were answered poorly have been identified and we have arranged a series of revision sessions to review these topics with pupils. The sessions will take place on the following dates:

Tuesday 5th February 3-4pm: Biology Tuesday 12th February 3-4pm: Chemistry Tuesday 26th February 3-4pm: Physics

On each evening three sessions will run; one for students studying Triple Science, one for students studying Trilogy who will sit the higher tier and one for students studying Trilogy who will sit the foundation tier. Pupils will be advised of which session they should attend on the day if they are unsure. This year we are asking that pupils complete a series of exam questions as a prerequisite for attending the revision sessions. This is to ensure that time is used more effectively in the sessions to address the skills and knowledge with which the pupils need the most support. The exam questions will be printed the week before each revision session and pupils will be able to collect them them from the Science prep room during the school day. Pupils will not be allowed to attend the revision sessions unless they bring the exam questions with them that they have completed.
