# Headteacher's Message

Dear parents and carers,

As we get to the end of the first week of the spring term it is worth taking stock and reflecting on the experiences we have all had in connection with remote learning. It is safe to say that it is a challenging time but we have a common goal - to do our best to provide a good learning experience for our students, your children.

This week I have received feedback from a number of parents about their experience of remote learning; thank you for that. On reflection of this feedback and considering the experiences of my staff I wanted to share a few points with you.

We are absolutely committed to providing the four to five hours of learning for our pupils each day but that will take a variety of forms:

- Google Meet live lessons
- video instruction
- tutorial style drop-ins (ideal for pupils to ask questions)
- online dialogue
- downloadable worksheets
- and other appropriate remote learning activities.

We believe that this varied approach is engaging and appropriate. Where lessons are not live, I have asked teachers to be available to support or answer questions during your child's timetabled slot in every subject. Teachers will not be available other than that slot because they are teaching other groups.

We recognise the broad spectrum of resources and facilities for accessing remote learning that families and homes have, particularly with many of you also working from home. We appreciate that many of you are juggling work, homeschooling, childcare and all the demands that lockdown places on us. The variety of approaches to remote learning noted previously are with these varied demands in mind.

# Headteacher's Message

Some parents have given feedback that indicates they are managing everything but some of you have told me that the sheer weight of work is overwhelming for your child, and in turn for you.

With this all in mind I have met with the Curriculum Leaders and asked them to ensure that the work set each lesson is appropriate for a one hour lesson, or that when it is reviewed at the end of the hour the task is extended to the next timetabled lesson. All we expect children to do is work for the duration of the timetabled hour then move on to their next lesson. I do not expect teachers to set work additional to what can realistically be completed in an hour lesson, so homework will not be set. As with the usual course of a day in school, not every remote lesson will result in a piece of assessed work or work which needs marking. I recognise some pupils will work in greater depth and challenge themselves but I urge them to stick to the parameters of their timetable because we need to ensure that they access the full range and balance of subjects. When your child is in school they experience a broad and balanced curriculum with all subjects developing a wide range of skills. During the closure our teachers are still planning and providing for this. Please ensure that your child accesses the learning from all subjects.

I hope that this clarifies our approach and expectations. Thank you for all that you are doing at home and for your ongoing support.
