

PARENT BULLETIN 14 Dec - 18 Dec 2020: Week 2



Headteacher's Message

Dear parents and carers,

You may be aware that the government advised schools this week to close to pupils 1 day early on Thursday 17th December. This is following guidance from Public Health England. A summary of the main points are as follows:

- School and college leaders are being asked to undertake contact tracing, if necessary, for six days after the end of term. This, in effect, means we could be phoning parents up to Christmas Eve informing them of the need to cancel their Christmas Day plans and self-isolate.
- If schools close to pupils after Thursday 17th, this means that the six-day contact tracing window will finish on 23rd December.

It is disappointing to me that the government has placed the burden of this decision firmly on headteachers rather than take the bold decision to close all schools nationally. There will undoubtedly be some families who are desperately worried about Christmas and who will favour the early closure, yet there will also be families who believe we should not finish early, so whichever decision we take as a school, it will not suit everyone.

Having consulted the school's Governing Body, I have decided that Parklands will close after school on **Thursday, 17th December**. One less day in school reduces the risk of any of our students or staff catching the virus and having to isolate over the Christmas period. This was made all the more poignant this week when we were notified of positive cases in Year 11, resulting in the whole year group having to self-isolate.

The much-publicised symptoms of Covid (eg new continuous cough, high temperature, lack of smell/taste) were not displayed in the recent cases we've had at school. More typically, the students who have tested positive complained of the symptoms below:

- Headaches
- Feeling unwell, especially tired & lethargic
- Feeling sick (but not being sick)
- Sickness & diarrhoea

With this in mind, we would ask you to be especially vigilant regarding your child's health, and should they display any of the above symptoms, we request that you keep your child off school for 48 hours.

We have also been notified of the reduction from Monday of the self-isolation period. All we know at the moment is what is contained in the news - see <u>https://www.bbc.co.uk/news/health-55274147</u>.

Covid over Christmas

As Christmas approaches, we would like to remind everyone of the importance of keeping up the high Covid safety standards we have maintained so far. No-one wants to have to miss Christmas because they have to be in isolation or run the risk of transferring the virus to any relatives who may be vulnerable.

- Any contact that your child has with a person who turns out to be a positive Covid case <u>after</u> <u>Friday 11th December</u> would mean that they would have to be in isolation over Christmas day.
- If your child tests positive 48 hours since being in school, you do not need to inform school. The NHS Track & Trace system will deal with contact tracing.
- If your child tests positive up to 48 hours after finishing school, please email us at attendance@parklandsacademy.co.uk
- We will then conduct a track and trace of students who are close contacts to inform them of the requirement to isolate and for how long

E-Scooters

A message from the Lancashire Constabulary Road Safety Partnership regarding E-Scooters.

E-Scooters have been in the news over the past months as an eco-friendly method of transport.

It is inevitable that some students will receive one of these for a Christmas present.

Currently it is illegal to ride an E-Scooter on a public road or pavement in Lancashire. They are classed as a motor vehicle and subject to the same legal requirements such as MOT, Tax, Licensing and Insurance.

The attached leaflet explains in more detail what the situation is regarding E-Scooters; the fact that they cannot be ridden on the public highway and so should not be ridden to school.

We would appreciate it if you could make your students and parents/guardians aware of this information prior to the end of term, especially if they are considering these as Christmas presents.
