

#### STEM at Parklands

Last week, our two teams of Year 8 EDT Bronze Industrial Cadets travelled to the University of Liverpool for the grand final of the competition. This was a 12 week project, during which the teams created models, videos and presentations, as well as visiting our industrial mentors NSG Environmental Ltd. Following excellent feedback for both teams from the online assessment day, we were quietly hopeful of success in Liverpool ... and Team 2 won the Teamwork Award for the North West!



As if that wasn't enough, most of the members of Team 1 also took part in a competition that ran simultaneously with Raytheon Technologies, to design a Quadcopter to be used by the emergency services. Despite missing the original deadline (due to no fault of their own) team members worked throughout the weekend to put together a video that accompanied their research and presentation - and made it through to the next stage with a score of 96 out of 100! This is a remarkable achievement, as they were up against dozens of other schools across the region, most of whom have taken part in the competition in previous years.

So congratulations all round to both of the Year 8 STEM teams!

#### Water safety advice

As temperatures rise, it's tempting to cool off with a swim in a river, canal, lake or reservoir. Lancashire Fire and Rescue Service is regularly called to rescue people who have got into trouble in the water.

#### What are the dangers?

- 1 There is no supervision.
- 1 The cold water temperature can claim your life in minutes - even if you are a strong swimmer.
- 1 It's difficult to estimate the depth of the water. It may be much deeper or much shallower than expected.
- There are often no suitable places to get out of the water due to steep slimy banks or sides.

- There is no way of knowing what lies beneath - there could be weeds, pipes, shopping trolleys, sharp metal or broken bottles.
- Swimming in open water can lead to a variety of serious illnesses.
- 1 There may be hidden currents. Flowing water or swimming in the sea can be especially dangerous.
- Alcohol and swimming don't mix perception and capability are both affected by drinking.

#### What should I do if I see someone in difficulty?

Alert someone, preferably a lifeguard. Or, dial 999 and ask for the fire and rescue service. Explain your location clearly and describe any landmarks.

#### **Enjoy the water safely this summer**

- Swim somewhere safe the swimming baths.
- Obey the warning signs around reservoirs, lakes, canals, rivers and at the beach.
- Value your own safety first jumping into the water to rescue pets or belongings can be highly dangerous.
- Know what to do in an emergency ring 999 and ask for the fire and rescue service. Explain your location clearly and describe any landmarks.
- Fnjoy organised water sports in a safe environment - with the correct equipment and a qualified instructor.


All sessions are free to attend, and in addition to the bookable activities, your child will also receive:
