Operation Encompass Parents Awareness Letter

Dear Parent/Carer,

This letter is to inform you / remind you that our school/ college is participating in Operation Encompass.

Operation Encompass is a unique Police and Education early intervention safeguarding partnership which ensures that a child/ young person's school/ college is informed, prior to the start of the next school day, that there has been a domestic abuse, vulnerable child or missing incident to which the child or young person has been exposed, and which might then have an impact on them in school/ college the following day.

Each school is informed of all such incidents, not just those where an offence can be identified or those which are graded as high risk. The partnership recognises that all domestic abuse, vulnerable child and missing incidents can be harmful to children and young people.

This information will be shared throughout the year, including holidays and weekends. Information will only be shared with the school/ college by the police where it is identified that a young person was present, witnessed or was involved.

A nominated member of staff, known as a Key Adult, has been trained to liaise with the police. At **Parklands High School** our Key Adults are **Mrs Fairhurst and Mrs Haslam**. They will be able to use information that has been shared with them, in confidence, to ensure that the school makes provision for possible difficulties experienced by children or their families. The Key Adults will keep this information confidential and will only share it on a need to know basis, for instance, to teaching staff for the child or young person. It will not be shared with other school students.

This national initiative has been implemented across the whole of the Lancashire Police area. If you would like some more information about it, you can view it online at www.operationencompass.org.

We are keen to offer the best support possible for our pupils and a recent review of Operation Encompass showed that it is beneficial and supportive for all those involved. **Yours sincerely,**

Whole School Messages

Lockdown Practice

We are writing to inform you that our annual lockdown practice will take place on the week commencing 9th February.

Just as we practice fire drills to ensure we can evacuate the building safely, it is essential that we practice "lockdown" procedures to ensure we can keep everyone safe indoors should an emergency arise.

The aim of this drill is to test our procedures and ensure staff are confident in their responsibilities.

To minimise disruption and anxiety:

- The drill will be explained to pupils beforehand (during registration or assemblies) so they understand what to do.
- Staff will guide pupils calmly throughout the process.
- The focus is on safety and preparedness.

Parklands' lockdown procedure is designed to protect pupils and staff in various situations, such as:

- An intruder or unauthorised person on school grounds.
- A local environmental hazard (e.g., chemical spillage, smoke, or dangerous animal).
- Extreme weather events.
- Malicious, false or threatening emails or correspondence

During the practice, an audio signal will play. Staff will secure classrooms, lock doors and windows, and keep pupils calm and away from clear view. No entry to the school grounds will be permitted for the duration of the drill. Once the procedure is successfully tested, the Headteacher or Senior Leadership Team will sound the "all clear."

We hope we never have to use these procedures for a real emergency, but being fully prepared is the best way to ensure the safety of our school community.



Learning Support

Learning Support - Every Minute Counts: The Importance of Being in Lessons

We want every student to make the most of their learning time. Even a few minutes missed from each lesson can quickly add up and have a big impact on progress.

For example, if a child misses just 5 minutes from every lesson each day, that adds up to around 4 hours of learning lost every week. Some students are missing as much as 16 minutes per day as they are arriving late and/or leaving early. That's the equivalent of over 7 hours of learning time lost every week.

We fully appreciate that sometimes students need time to reset, reflect, or take a short break and these moments are important for wellbeing. However, we also want to highlight just how valuable lesson time is.

Every minute spent in the classroom contributes to a stronger understanding, better progress, and greater confidence in learning.

It is our job to work together to make sure our students are present, ready, and making the most of every learning opportunity.


