Headteacher's Message

Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been an incredibly busy and purposeful week here at school. Our corridors have been buzzing with activity, from university visits to professional interviews, as we continue to support our students in broadening their horizons and preparing for the future.

Highlights from This Week

It's been a week of "real-world" experiences and looking ahead:

- Lancaster University Visit: On Monday, some of our Year 10 students enjoyed an insightful trip to Lancaster University. These visits are vital for demystifying higher education and helping our pupils see the exciting paths available to them.
- Year 11 Mock Interview Day: Today has been particularly impressive. Our Year 11s have been "under the spotlight," taking part in formal interviews with representatives from local businesses. This experience is invaluable for building the "employability skills" that will set them apart in the future.
- Boys' Assemblies: Throughout the week, we held targeted assemblies for Boys in Years 7 through 11, focusing on real life concerns about online dangers, specifically what is known as 'sextortion'. The boys in all year groups took the messages seriously and behaved maturely. This was directed at boys as they are the group at most risk of this crime. This was an additional session, as this topic is covered for all pupils as part of the Secure programme.
- Student Leadership: Our Head Pupil led an excellent online assembly focussing on mental health, demonstrating the fantastic leadership talent we have within our student body.
- Year 9 Progress Evening took place on Thursday. This is a crucial time for Year 9 as they begin to consider their specialisms, and we were able to discuss their achievements and potential with parents and carers.

Looking Ahead to Next Week

We have a packed schedule to lead us into the holidays:

- Year 7 Respect Day takes place on Monday. This is a day where Year 7 pupils will focus on disability awareness and this should be an enjoyable and informative day for them.
- Year 9 Specialisms Launch takes place on Thursday. This assembly marks the start of the specialisms process, helping Year 9s begin to choose the subjects they will specialise in for their GCSEs.
- Health & Wellbeing: On Tuesday, we will be hosting DTP/ACWY immunisations for Year 9. We also have staff Refresher Diabetes training taking place, as we ensure our whole school community is looked after.

- Creative Talents: Good luck to our Year 11 Dance students, who will be completing their formal exams on Monday and Tuesday.
- Travel Preparations: On Monday evening, we will be hosting a meeting for parents of students attending the Edinburgh History Trip.

Lockdown Practice

We are writing to inform you that our annual lockdown practice will take place on the week commencing 9th February.

Just as we practice fire drills to ensure we can evacuate the building safely, it is essential that we practice "lockdown" procedures to ensure we can keep everyone safe indoors should an emergency arise.

The aim of this drill is to test our procedures and ensure staff are confident in their responsibilities. To minimise disruption and anxiety:

- The drill will be explained to pupils beforehand (during registration or assemblies) so they understand what to do.
- Staff will guide pupils calmly throughout the process.
- The focus is on safety and preparedness.

Parklands' lockdown procedure is designed to protect pupils and staff in various situations, such as:

- An intruder or unauthorised person on school grounds.
- A local environmental hazard (e.g., chemical spillage, smoke, or dangerous animal).
- Extreme weather events.
- Malicious, false or threatening emails or correspondence

During the practice, an audio signal will play. Staff will secure classrooms, lock doors and windows, and keep pupils calm and away from clear view. No entry to the school grounds will be permitted for the duration of the drill. Once the procedure is successfully tested, the Headteacher or Senior Leadership Team will sound the "all clear."

We hope we never have to use these procedures for a real emergency, but being fully prepared is the best way to ensure the safety of our school community.




Attendance Update: Every Lesson Counts

This term, we are renewing our focus on attendance and punctuality. We know that high attendance is the key to raising GCSE grades, but it also ensures your child remains socially connected, forming better friendships and taking full advantage of our extra-curricular clubs.

How we are supporting your child:

- **FT Check-ins:** Form Tutors will now have a brief "wellbeing check-in" with any student returning to school after time off to ensure they are caught up and supported.
- **Targeted Support:** Students classified as *persistently absent* will meet with a member of SLT or their HAL. These meetings are designed to help us understand how we can remove barriers to their attendance.

We are asking for support from all parents and carers to uphold high expectations. Please ensure your child is in school, on time, every day. Let's work together to maximise their potential!

Did you know?

- 90% attendance sounds good, but it equals **½ a day of school missed every week**.
- Over one school year, 90% attendance is **4 weeks of missed learning**.

Please support us by ensuring your child attends school every day.

Learning Support

Learning Support - Every Minute Counts: The Importance of Being in Lessons

We want every student to make the most of their learning time. Even a few minutes missed from each lesson can quickly add up and have a big impact on progress.

For example, if a child misses just 5 minutes from every lesson each day, that adds up to around 4 hours of learning lost every week. Some students are missing as much as 16 minutes per day as they are arriving late and/or leaving early. That's the equivalent of over 7 hours of learning time lost every week.

We fully appreciate that sometimes students need time to reset, reflect, or take a short break and these moments are important for wellbeing. However, we also want to highlight just how valuable lesson time is.

Every minute spent in the classroom contributes to a stronger understanding, better progress, and greater confidence in learning.

It is our job to work together to make sure our students are present, ready, and making the most of every learning opportunity.


