Headteacher's Message

Dear parents, carers and students,

Happy New Year! I hope you had a lovely break with your family and friends, although we are aware of a large number of students and staff who, due to catching COVID, were unable to see relatives and celebrate in the usual way.

We expect all students to return to school on Monday, as staffing levels have improved. If that situation changes over the weekend, I shall ensure you are contacted via Edulink and our social media accounts will also provide you with the necessary information.

Face coverings

Thank you for your continued support with these. As per government guidance, this will be reviewed later in the month.

From Tuesday, 11th January

Covid testing rules are to be eased for people <u>without symptoms</u>, who will no longer need to confirm a positive lateral flow test with a PCR.

Under the new guidance, anyone in England who receives a positive lateral flow device (LFD) test result should report their result on <u>gov.uk</u> and must self-isolate immediately, but will not need to take a follow-up PCR test.

After reporting a positive LFD test result, they will be contacted by NHS Test and Trace so that their contacts can be traced.

Anyone who tests positive will be able to leave self-isolation seven days after the date of their initial positive test if they receive two negative lateral flow test results, 24 hours apart, on days six and seven.

The change will also improve access to PCR tests for people with symptoms and for healthcare, transport and other key workers following problems over test supplies.

For people with symptoms, you must still follow up a positive LFD test with a PCR test.



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Headteacher's Message

Information on the vaccination programme for 12 to 15 year olds

Young people aged 12 to 15 in England are now being offered a second dose of the Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine at a minimum of 12 weeks from the first dose, following advice from the Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI). Parents can book vaccinations for their child, if aged 12 or over, through the NHS booking system. Vaccination for this group will also continue to be carried out by the school age immunisation service (SAIS). In school vaccination will begin from Monday 10 January but to date we have not been contacted. As usual, consent will be required and we shall contact parents/carers in due course regarding this. There is no need to contact us about this at the moment. Please see the guidance on COVID-19 vaccination: resources for schools and parents for further information and resources on the vaccination programme.

School trips

Please be advised that any changes to school trip requirements for pre-booked visits <u>are not due to Parklands</u> but due to changes to entry imposed by specific countries and the guidance we receive from travel companies. This is the case for our trip to Barcelona this year. However frustrating this may be, please do not vent any anger/frustration at school. I have contacted my teaching union regarding such changes in the hope they can influence government to provide financial assistance where necessary.


